The Oregon Department of Justice Crime Victims' Services Division partnered with the Oregon State Police Law Enforcement Data System and the Oregon Judicial Department to coordinate informationsharing and avoid having to work through a private vendor. This interagency collaboration represents an estimated cost-savings of \$150,000 per year.
