health of rural populations in Oregon through conducting and promoting health research in partnership with the communities and practitioners they serve.

"We are pleased to be working with rural primary care practices like those in ORPRN," says Michael Barry, M.D., President of the Foundation for Informed Medical Decision Making. "They are committed to changing the face of healthcare by inviting patients to play an active role, working with their providers, in deciding what care is best for them."


Many other decision aid topics are available, Anderson says. "Our clinic also has decision aids for a wide variety of conditions besides the three used in the

study. People are encouraged to view them to learn more about the conditions and treatment options." The clinic received two portable DVD players as part of the study and anyone interested may view these materials in the clinic conference room, she added.

The other Decision Aid topics include several on Breast Cancer,

Prostate issues, Uterine issues, Menopause, Coronary Heart Disease, Living with Diabetes, Living Better with Chronic Pain, Heart Failure, Colon Cancer Screening, Chronic Low Back Pain and related issues, Herniated Disc Treatment Options, Hip Osteoarthritis Treatment Options, Getting the Healthcare That's

Right for You, Choices for Medical Care When You're Seriously Ill, and Weight Loss Surgery.
