was farmers and ranchers willing to keep an open mind about a new enterprise and give me a chance," Felda says. "There's a lot of openness in the agricultural community for new ideas and methods."

Felda says the sheep industry is also open to new ideas, and is starting to recognize the value of dairy as an additional asset.

Felda started out with about 40 sheep, and got her dairy license in 2008. She now runs a herd of 125, though she's only milking around 70 currently. She says she milked 15 thousand pounds of milk last year, but is hoping for more this year with the addition of new equipment.

All that milking isn't done by hand; a vacuum-operated milking machine allows her to put six ewes through her stan-

chions at a time. The milk is pumped into sealed buckets and then strained into plastic buckets to be put in the freezer to sit at zero degrees until delivery.

The ability to freeze the milk is one thing that separates it from cow's milk. Unlike cow's milk, the high number of fat solids in sheep's milk means it doesn't separate when frozen, so the thawed product is identical to the pre-frozen version. Since it doesn't have to be delivered immediately, it's more economical for the producer.

Though she's happy with the improvements she's made, Felda says it isn't on the scale of most cow dairies.

"Most cow dairies have pipelines to carry the milk away, and they're all computerized. Our technology is lagging behind a few years because most sheep dairies are small operations," says Felda.

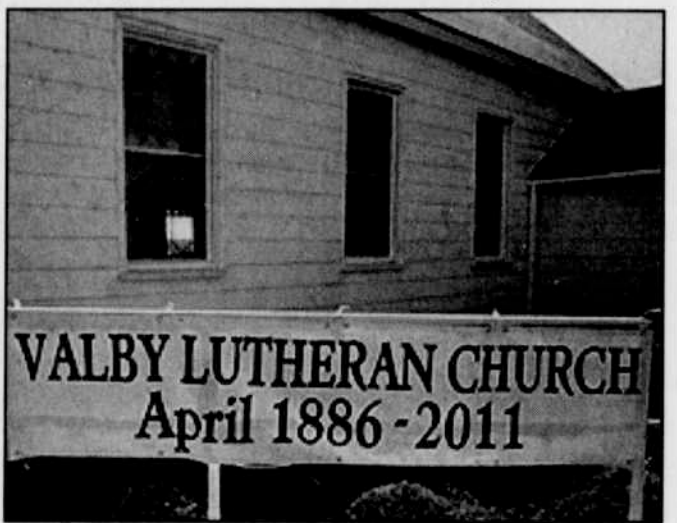
In fact, Tin Willows is one of only three sheep dairies in Oregon, the other two being on the western side of the state. It's that eastern Oregon diet of bunch grass and sage that Felda says makes her milk the star ingredient in Tin Willows Tomme.

"[Black Sheep Creamery] noticed a difference in the milk, and made a cheese to accent that flavor. They created Tin Willow Tomme for my milk," she says.

Tin Willows Tomme was one of only two northwest cheeses in a list dominated by Californians. Felda says that Tin Willows milk is special but the credit goes to Black Sheep Creamery, which is a nationally-recognized cheese maker.

"I'm excited they were listed in the top eight," says Felda. "They worked very hard and they deserve it."

Valby celebrates 125 years

On May 1, over 100 members, friends and former pastors of Valby Lutheran Church attended an afternoon celebration to mark the historic church's 125th anniversary. The small church south of Ione was founded on April, 1886 by Swedish immigrants; for many years all services were in Swedish. Bishop Dave Brauer-Rieke pointed out that Valby is the oldest Lutheran church in Oregon still worshipping in its original building.

The festivities began with a Swedish smorgasbord organized by Sandi and Dan Richardson of Condon, with food also prepared by members of the church. Flowers were available to place on graves, with freewill donations given to Carmelo Di Salvo, a Lutheran seminary student who lives in Heppner. Cookbooks and history books from the church were also on sale, and continue to be available.

Church council president Louis Carlson then introduced the granddaughter of the Pettersons, who originally donated the

land for Valby. Eight former preachers were in attendance, as well as the bishop, and all shared memories of serving Valby. Several humorous stories involved Valby's historic outhouse but church members were quick to point out that, as of April 30, the church now has a modern, plumbed, indoor restroom.

Following the lunch and fellowship, about half of the attendees stayed for a worship service led by the current minister, Lea Mathieu, with participation from all other the Lutheran ministers. Rikka Tews, Valby's former pianist who now lives in The Dalles, provided music for the service. The offering from the service will be donated to Lutheran World Relief to benefit victims of the recent hurricanes in the Southeast.
