James Harold Wishart



James 'Jim' Harold Wishart, formerly of Heppner, passed away on Friday, May 20, 2011, in Hood River, Oregon, surrounded by his loving family.

Jim was born in Klickitat, Washington, on August 23, 1928, to Frank U. Wishart and Mary Jane Bostick Wishart. He lived in small sawmill towns and had many memories of living in Dee, Oregon. He loved to fish and hunt in his younger years.

He graduated from Hood River High School in 1947 where he enjoyed playing football. After business school in Portland, he began his banking career with the Hood River First National Bank.

He was on the first draft call for the Korean War and the Army sent him to the front lines in Korea, where he served as a sergeant from November 8, 1950, to October 28, 1952. After resuming his banking career, he married Camilla Fleisher in Hood River, Oregon. They were married for 57 years and had four children.

Jim worked in Union, Heppner, Prairie City and Arlington, Oregon. After working 25 years for First Interstate he went to work for the Bank of Eastern Oregon where he was employed for 18 years.

Jim made many friends and was very active in the communities where they lived. In 2005, the Wisharts moved back to Hood River. Jim was preceded in death by his parents, his brother Harry and his nephew, Kyle Linn.

He is survived by his wife, Camilla, children, Sally Brown of Paisley, Florida, Susie Combs of Prairie City, Oregon, Jim Wishart, Boardman, Oregon, and John Wishart, Hood River, six grandchildren and almost eight great-grandchildren. His nieces and nephew were also a big part of his family.

There will be no funeral or memorial service. A private gathering, along with the scattering of Jim's ashes, will be held at a later date.

Sheriff's office investigates suspicious death in Irrigon

According to a release from the Morrow County District Attorney's office, the Morrow County Sheriff's Office, with the assistance of the Morrow/Umatilla County Major Crime Team, are investigating a death in Irrigon.

On May 24 at around 4:54 a.m., the Morrow County Sheriff's dispatch received a 911 call from Irrigon resident Wade Bonner stating that two people were stealing gas on his property. Bonner then hung up the phone; efforts to re-contact Bonner were unsuccessful. A MCSO deputy arrived on the scene around 5:10 a.m. After a search of the property, the deputy located Bonner, who was dead at the scene. He died from a gunshot to the head.

Fifth Sunday Worship at All Saints

Traditionally, Rogation Days were celebrated on the Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday before Ascension Day, which this year falls next Thursday, June 2. The word "rogation" has its roots in a Latin word which means to ask or petition, and it comes from one of the Bible passages traditionally read on the Sunday before Ascension. In some places, Rogation Days have included elaborate celebrations and a procession from the church to and around the fields of its members, asking for God's blessing.

Rogation Sunday at All Saints will focus on honoring God for the gift of creation and praying that God will bless the seed, the soil and the labors of those who feed the world.

Worship begins at 10 a.m. Everyone is welcome.
