PUBLIC NOTICE AND NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Morrow County is eligible to apply for a 2011 Community Development Block Grant from the Oregon Business Development Department. Community Development Block Grant funds come from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The grants can be used for public facilities and housing improvements, primarily for persons with low and moderate incomes. Approximately \$15 million will be awarded to Oregon non-metropolitan cities and counties in 2011. The maximum grant that a city or county can receive is \$2,000,000. Morrow County is preparing an application for a 2011 Community Development Block Grant from the Oregon Business Development Department for a housing rehabilitation grant in Morrow County for housing rehabilitation projects. It is estimated that the proposed project will benefit at least 50 persons,

of whom 100% will be low or moderate income. A public hearing will be held by the Morrow County Court at 10:00 a.m. on June 15, 2011 at the Port of Morrow Riverfront Center, 2 Marine Drive, Boardman, OR. The purpose of this hearing is for the County Court to obtain citizen views and to respond to questions and comments about: Community development and housing needs, especially the needs of low and moderate income persons, as well as other needs in the community that might be assisted with a Community Development Block Grant project; and the proposed project. Written comments are also welcome and must be received by June 14, 2011 at P.O. Box 788, Heppner, OR 97836. Both oral and written comments will be considered by the County Court in deciding whether to apply. The location of the hearing is accessible to persons with disabilities. Please let Karen Wolff, Personnel Director at 541-676-5620 know if you will need any special accommodations to attend or participate in the meeting.

More information about Oregon Community Development Block Grants, the proposed project, and records about the County's past use of Community Development Block Grant funds is available for public review at the Morrow County Courthouse, Personnel Office during regular office hours. Advance notice is requested. If special accommodations are needed, please notify Karen Wolff, Personnel Director at 541-676-5620 so that appropriate assistance can be provided. Permanent involuntary displacement of persons or businesses is not anticipated as a result from the proposed project.
