

DA's Report

The Morrow County District Attorney's Office has released the following report:

-Jack Hubbert Statton, 73, was convicted of felon possess firearm, a Class C felony reduced to a Class A misdemeanor. The sentence of 180 days incarceration was suspended and the defendant sentenced to 36 months bench probation. Total fines, fees and assessments were \$183.

Oregon lawmakers extend tribal police authority

Rep. Greg Smith was one of three Republicans in the Oregon House of Representatives who voted to give tribal police the same off-reservation authority as non-tribal officers during a time-span from 2013 to 2015.

Smith, Andy Olson of Albany and Matt Wingard of Wilsonville joined all 30 House Democrats in approving the measure in a 33-25 vote. The Senate approved the measure 19-10; it now goes to Gov. John Kitzhaber, who says he supports the bill.

According to the Associated Press, the measure would give tribal officers limited authority off reservations for two years, including the power to continue pursuing suspects who leave tribal land and to take action when a crime is committed in front of them. Under the measure, tribal police officers would be granted limited police authority if they obtain certification from the state Department of Public Safety Standards and Training and the tribe agrees to certain rules of insurance, tort liability and evidence. The Oregon State Sheriffs' Association was the most vocal opponent of the measure, saying it would open the door to lawsuits and give tribal officers authority off the reservation while continuing to restrict authority of non-tribal officers on reservations.

It was reported that the city did \$25,000 worth of repairs to two sewer lines that go over Hinton Creek on bridges. The lines were knocked out in the recent flooding and were reinforced to better withstand flood waters in the future.

It was announced that city crew member Robert Whalen had passed his certified water operator's test in June, so the city has another certified operator.
