Norman C. DeBoer, 92, died June 29, 2011 at his home in Boardman, OR.

Norm was born on a farm near Manhattan, MT on December 2, 1918 to parents Charles and Anna Bouma DeBoer. Norm had his elementary education in country schools and rode the bus into Manhattan for his high school. He graduated from Multnomah School of the Bible in Portland and served as a 2nd Lt. in the army during WWII.

Norm was united in marriage to Marie Wark from Moccasin, MT on October 13, 1944. Three children were born to their union: Cheryl, Steven and Suella. They lived on a small cattle ranch and he worked at Yellowstone Pine Saw Mill as a lumber grader.

DA's Report

The Morrow County District Attorney's office has released the following report:

-Shawn Tracy Adlard, 55, was convicted of unauthorized use of a vehicle, a Class C felony, and given 2 years supervised probation. Adlard was also convicted of criminal mischief in the second degree, a Class A misdemeanor. The sentence of 180 days incarceration was suspended and the defendant given 2 years bench probation. Adlard was also convicted of criminal driving while

suspended or revoked, a Class A misdemeanor. The sentence of 180 days incarceration was suspended and the defendant given 2 years bench probation. Total fines, fees and assessments were \$5,014.
