Sylvia E. McDaniel, 99, longtime Heppner resident, died Saturday, July 23, 2011 at Pioneer Memorial Hospital. A graveside service will be held at 2 p.m. on Thursday, July 28, 2011 at the Heppner Masonic Cemetery.

She was born November 2, 1911, the eldest of four children born to George and Jessie Carter Smith, in the small community of Top in Grant County. She attended a one-room school at Top, later going to high school in Monument.

On November 9, 1929 she married Carl McDaniel in Heppner. That same year, Carl started work with the United States Forest Service, so the couple's first years together were spent at the Desolation Guard Station on the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest. That guard station no longer exists. In 1939, Carl's employment switched from the US Forest Service to the US Fish and Wildlife Service, and the couple moved to Lonerock in Gilliam County. Their first child, Carolyn, was born in 1940. In 1944, they moved a final time, to Heppner, where they continued to live. Their daughter, Georgena, was born in 1951.

Sylvia had a long career in Heppner and Morrow County, beginning with summer fire season employment in 1944 and

1945 as a Forest Service lookout at Madison Butte and Tamarack lookouts on the Umatilla National Forest. She worked in the PMA and ag offices and then started as clerk in the Morrow County tax office. She next ran for and was elected county treasurer, a position she held until retirement.

In the 1960s, Sylvia became interested in art and took some art classes. She discovered a real talent for oil painting. She became well-known locally for her landscapes. A painting she did of the Morrow County Courthouse, where she worked for so many years, still hangs there. She was a devoted member of the Methodist Church since the 1940s.

Survivors include: her daughter, Carolyn; sister, Helen Jones; grandchildren, Douglas Barnes, Andrea Reed and Leslie Ashman; and great-grandchildren, Shannon and Connor Ashman and Victoria Reed.

She was preceded in death by: her husband, Carl, in 1996 and her daughter, Georgena, in 2011.

Though the summer reading program is about to end, the Heppner library will continue to offer story hour and special events throughout the year. Stop by the library or call 541-676-9964 for more information.



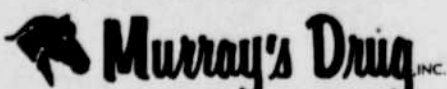
