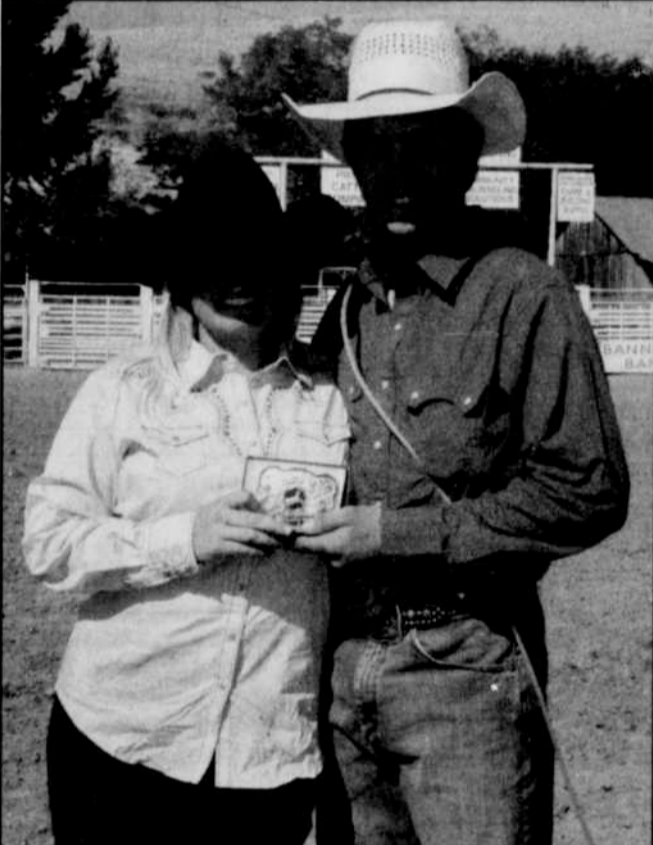
-BPD received report that someone broke into a church and made a mess. It was unknown if anything was taken.

Laurel Rd. in Boardman chasing motorcycles and vehicles out into the road.

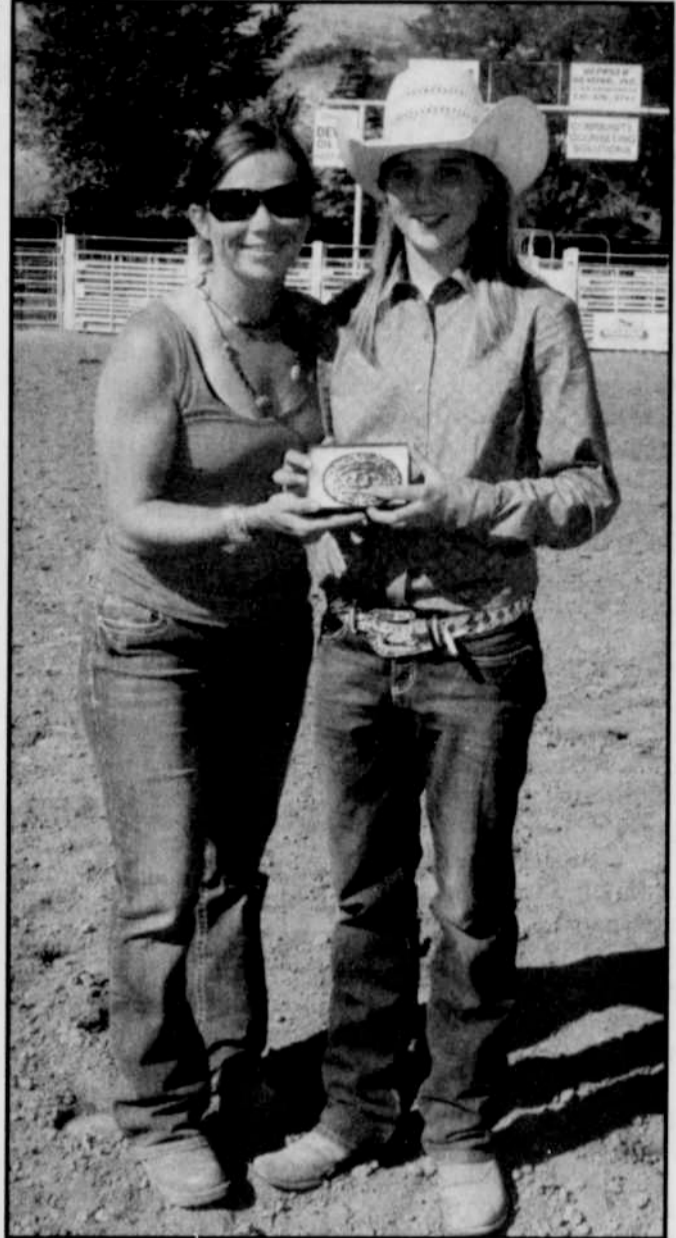
-MCSO received request for contact with a deputy from an Irri- gion subject regarding some strange things that had been happening at her home.

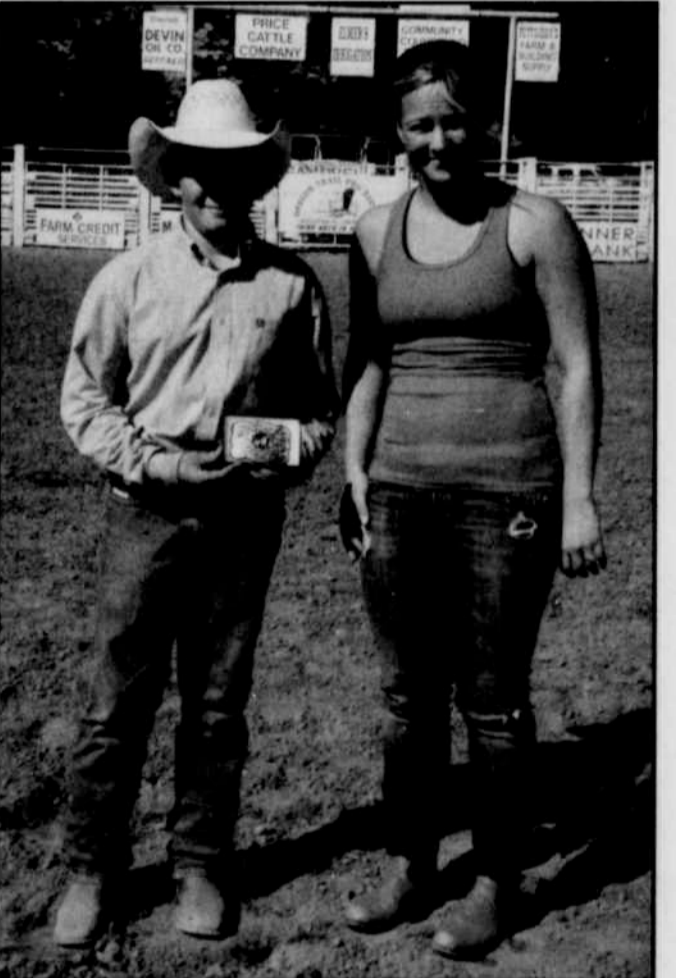
