In other housing business, Buschke said the heat pump at the apartments needs to be replaced at a cost of \$20,800, and she asked the council to use part of the funds from the sale of the HUD house on Court St. to pay for the unit.

"We are requesting that the council consider using the profit realized from the sale of the HUD house to fund this project," she said in a letter to the council. "The Senior Center's share of this cost is \$4,576 and would leave \$16,224 for the Heppner Housing Authority cost." The city received \$18,229 net profit from the HUD house sale.

The council took no action but some council members questioned if the city should ask the community for other possible uses of the money. The council took no action.

The council also received the Sheriff's Report for August.
