McCarl is the son of Leah Hyatt and Lee McCarl of Heppner.

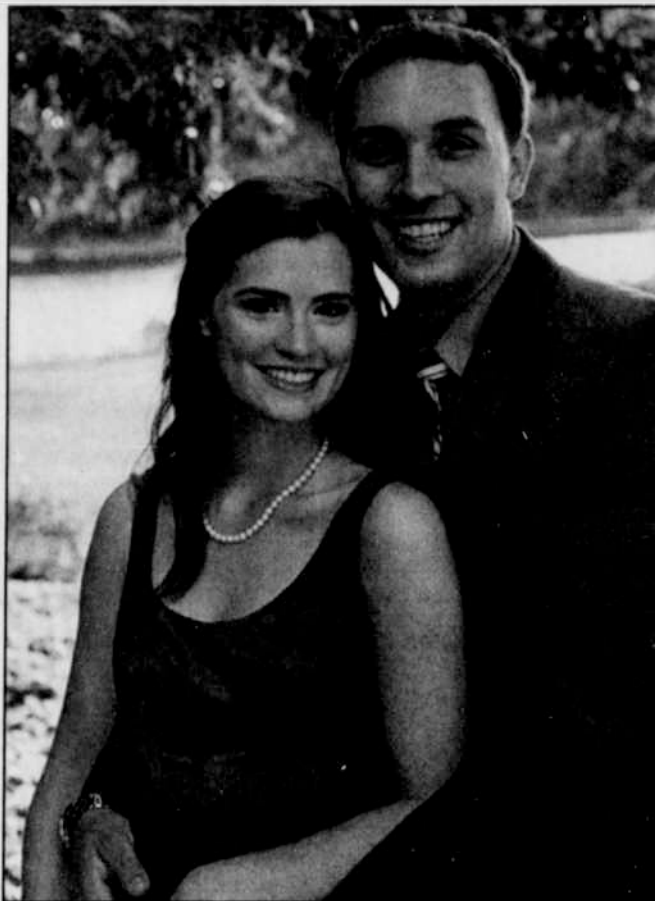

Halvorsen, Tetrick wedding

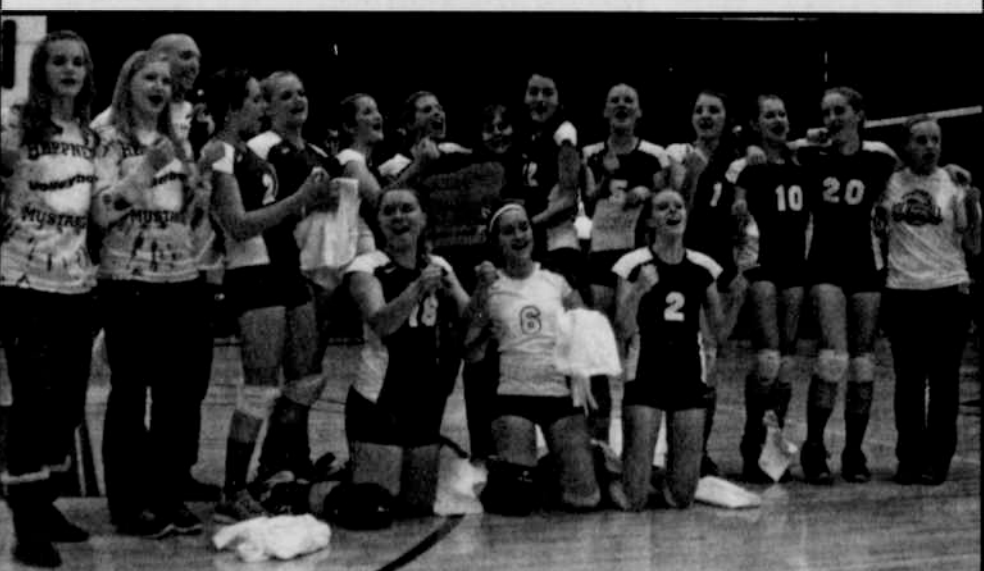


Andrew and Allison (Halvorsen) Tetrick
