

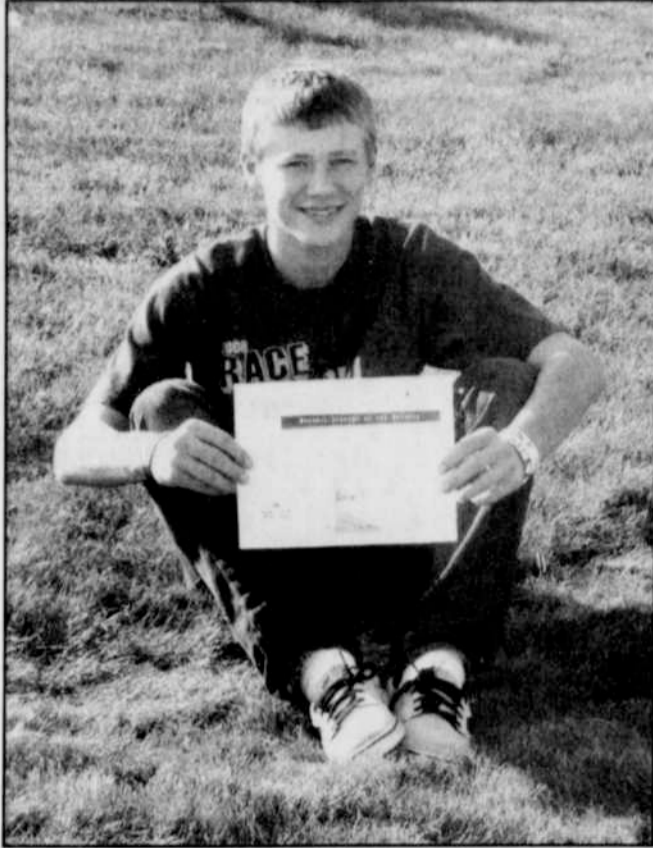

The Resolution will authorize the issuance, sale, execution and delivery of Port of Morrow Transmission Facilities Revenue Bonds (Bonneville Cooperation Project No. 1), in one or more series (the "Bonds"), approve the Bonds and other documents to be executed and delivered or distributed in connection therewith; and certain other matters related thereto.

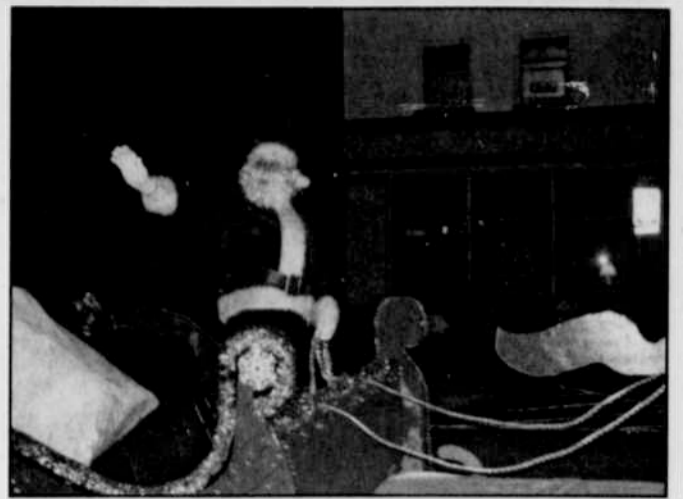


Heppner counts down to Christmas

It's that time again when the Heppner community gets ready for the holiday season and plans special events that incorporate merchant and community involvement. The season promises to be jam-packed with activities and celebrations.

Heppner rewards cards are back. November 14 through December 15, the Heppner chamber will be urging the community to "shop locally" by continuing the use of the "Christmas Rewards Card." There will be three cards, valued at \$10, \$20 and \$50. Customers will be given the appropriate rewards cards for the value of their purchase. Shoppers can collect the rewards cards and bring them to the Celebrate Heppner Christmas event on Thursday, December 15 to enter their cards for an opportunity to win great prizes that have been donated. Winners need not be present, but must have a designated person to enter the rewards cards and pick up the prize.

December 1 will start with a merchant's open house/customer appreciation day with extended hours to kick off Christmas shopping. The evening events will start at 5:30 p.m.

Basin). The parade entries will be invited to park at the fairgrounds, so parade-goers can plan on going out to the fairgrounds and checking out the lighted floats.

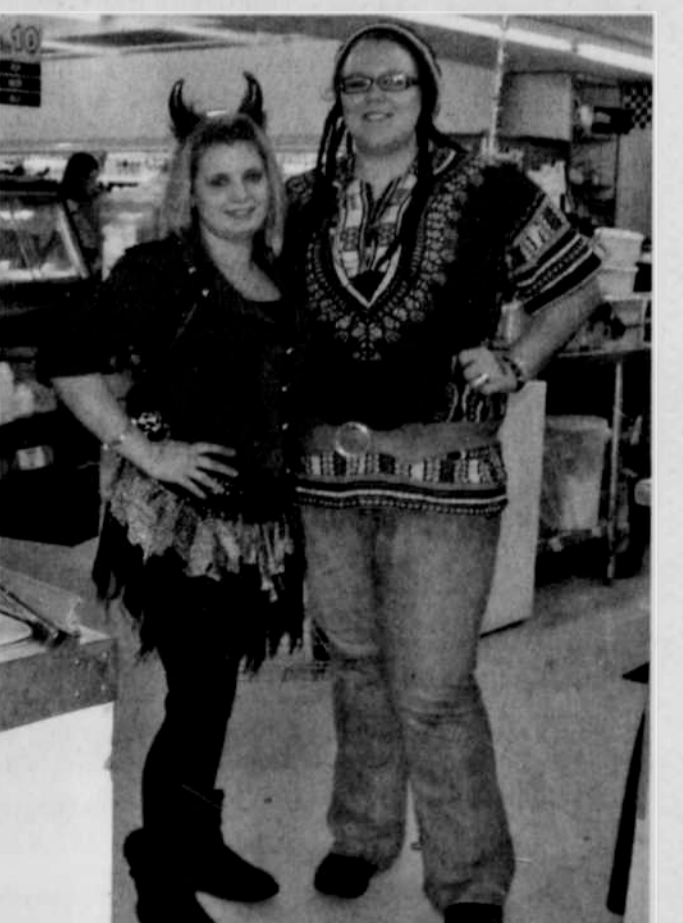
