

## Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office reports handling the following business:

Umatilla County Jail on a \$10,500.00 bail.

-MCSO received a call from a man in Boardman who would like an officer to make contact with his neighbor regarding the sprinkler that keeps coming onto his property.

-MCSO received a report from a male caller in Irrigon about his neighbors who are letting off fireworks and scaring his dog.

-MCSO received a report from a female caller in Irrigon about a truck that is throwing rocks all over the place and blaring loud music.

**July 9:** -Morrow County Sheriff's Office received a call from a female in Heppner that there were two vehicles parked in the middle of the road and had been there for about 30 minutes.

-MCSO received a report from a female in Irrigon that said her juvenile son was out of control and threatening her and other children and would like a deputy to speak with him because she can't control him.

-MCSO received a report from a man in Boardman that a subject had a purse on the trunk of their car and took off without it and would like someone to respond to pick it up.
