Transmission System, and all proceedings leading thereto, including the adoption of a resolution authorizing such matters.

#### SUMMARY OF THE MATTER PETITIONERS SEEK TO VALIDATE:

The United States Department of Energy, acting by and through Bonneville, has requested that the Port issue Bonds to: (a) finance or refinance the costs of acquisition, installation and/or construction of existing and future transmission facilities which are now or will be leased to Bonneville and which are: (i) to be specifically identified prior to the date of issuance and sale of the Bonds; (ii) integral to the "Federal transmission system" as such term is used in the Federal Columbia River Transmission System Act of 1974 (16 U.S.C. 838 et seq.); (iii) located in the State of Oregon and in other states within the geographical area of the "Pacific Northwest region" described in Section 4(d) of the Federal Columbia River Transmission System Act of 1974, 16 U.S.C. 838(d), and to (b) finance the costs of issuance of the Bonds.

Petitioners have brought this validation action pursuant to ORS Sections 33.710 and 33.720 for the judicial examination, approval, and confirmation of the validity and legality of the proceedings described above, including the Resolution, the execution and delivery of the Bonds, and the execution and delivery of the related Lease Commitments, Agency Agreements, Indentures, and Credit Agreements.

Notice is served and given to all electors, freeholders, taxpayers and other interested persons by publication of this Notice and Summons for once a week for four (4) successive weeks. Jurisdiction will be established over all electors, freeholders, taxpayers and other interested persons ten (10) days after the date of the completion of publication of this summons. Any interested person may at any time on or before January 30, 2012, appear and contest the validity of this petition by the filing of an answer or motion as described above with the trial court clerk or administrator of the Morrow County Circuit Court. If no response is made within the allotted time, Petitioners will apply to the court for the relief demanded in the petition.

## Navy revising environmental impact statement scope for Boardman Bombing Range

The U.S. Navy, in cooperation with the National Guard Bureau and the Oregon National Guard, is revising the scope of the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for Naval Weapons Systems Training Facility (NWSTF) Boardman to add new Special Use Airspace in the form of a new Military Operations Area (MOA). The new MOA would preserve the required training capabilities at NWSTF Boardman that are necessary to maintain training readiness, including the capability to continue low-altitude aviation training.

The Navy and the National Guard are reopening the scoping period and seeking public input to identify community concerns and issues about the proposed new MOA. All public comments previously received during the first scoping period (Oct. 5, 2010 - Nov. 15, 2010) are still valid and will be considered in the development of the Draft EIS. Previously-submitted comments need not be resubmitted. The Draft EIS is

anticipated to be released in summer 2012 for a 45-day public review and comment period.

Comprised of Special Use Airspace and Navy-controlled lands, NWSTF Boardman is located in north-central Oregon near the Columbia River, in Morrow County. It is approximately 2.5 miles south of Boardman and 16 miles southwest of Hermiston, near the Oregon-Washington border.

The mission of NWSTF Boardman is to support naval and joint services operational readiness by providing a suitable training range in the vicinity of Navy and Oregon National Guard forces in the northwest. The development of structures of significant height on lands beneath the existing Special Use Airspace has and may continue to result in the potential loss of ability to train with military aircraft at lower altitudes on the range.

To alleviate this situation, the Navy is considering the addition of new Special Use Airspace in the

form of a MOA to the north-east of the existing Special Use Airspace at NWSTF Boardman. This new MOA would preserve required training capabilities necessary to maintain military readiness, including low-altitude training.

The consideration of adding the MOA would be consistent with the Navy's Proposed Action at NWSTF Boardman announced on Oct. 5, 2010. The Navy and the National Guard have proposed to implement actions to maintain current military training activities as well as increase certain activities from current levels to support Navy and Oregon National Guard requirements; develop appropriate ranges and facilities; implement range enhancements; and accommodate mission requirements associated with force structure changes and the introduction of new weapons systems.

The Proposed Action would result in selectively focused but critical enhancements and increases in training necessary to ensure NWSTF Boardman

supports military training and readiness objectives. The Navy will analyze potential environmental effects from the training of U.S. military forces in military airspace above and land training areas within the boundaries of NWSTF Boardman.
