

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow
County Sheriff's Office reports handling the following business:

November 2:
-Morrow County Sheriff's Office received report that a deputy removed a dead deer from the highway.

-MCSO received report that an old Jackson County Sheriff's Office badge was turned into Irrigon Justice Court.

-MCSO received report of an injured pit bull type lying in a field behind the reporter's residence.

-MCSO, Heppner Fire Department reported a category 4 flood on the flood computer censor for the Heppner/Shobe Canyon Road area. The fire chief confirmed that the alarm was false.

-MCSO received report that Oregon State Police arrested Lisa Marie Hess, 37, for Failure to Pay Fine/Driving While Suspended. She was lodged at Marion County Jail with \$1,632 full bail with a hold placed for Morrow County.

-MCSO received report of a subject who said he lost his wallet with \$200 cash in it in Irrigon.

-MCSO received report of someone trying to grade the road with someone parked in the middle of the roadway on Blackhorse Canyon Lane/Bell Canyon, Heppner. A tow responded; the driver arrived and paid for the tow.

-MCSO received report of a student drinking at school in Boardman.

-MCSO received report of a theft of diesel and attempted burglary in Irrigon.

-MCSO received report of renters that wouldn't leave and theft of water from the well next door in Irrigon.

-MCSO deputy advised that the Department of Human Services wanted his assistance for a home visit in Irrigon.

-MCSO, Irrigon Fire Department received report of a vehicle fire in Irrigon.

-MCSO received report of a very large tan car with a headlight out driving down Washington Lane in Irrigon, looking in people's mailboxes.

-MCSO received report of kids in a car trespassing in the back of the caller's property. The caller said she knew their parents.

-MCSO received report that Stanfield Police Department arrested Keri Martin, 33, on a Irrigon Justice Court warrant for Failure to Appear/DUII. The subject was lodged at Umatilla County Jail with \$1,500 full bail with a hold placed for Morrow County.
