THE MORROW COUNTY COURT will hold the following hearing of public interest on Wednesday, February 15, 2012, at 10:00 a.m. at the Port of Morrow Riverfront Center, Boardman, Oregon.

Amendments to the Transportation System Plan (TSP), Comprehensive Plan (MCCP), Zoning Ordinance (MCZO) and Map, and Subdivision Ordinance ATSP-052; AC(M)-053; AZ-054; AZ(M)-055; AS-056: Applicant Port of Morrow. At this hearing the Morrow County will consider the recommendation of the Planning Commission to adopt the Port of Morrow and I-84/730 Interchange Area Management Plans (IAMPs) as amendments to the adopted Morrow County TSP. The IAMPs provide transportation improvement plans and Access Management Plans for areas in the vicinity of the two I-84 interchanges serving the Port of Morrow. The County is also proposing to amend the Zoning and Subdivision Ordinances to include notice and access management requirements. Criteria include the MCCP Review and Revision and Article 8 of the MCZO.

Opportunity to voice support or opposition to the above proposal or to ask questions will be provided. Failure to raise an issue in person or by letter or failure to provide sufficient specificity to afford the decision maker an opportunity to respond to the issue precludes appeal to the Land Use Board of Appeals based on those issues.
