ODFW December wolf update

The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife received 43 wolf reports during December. Of those, 20 wolf reports were from the western wolf management zone (14 sighting reports, five tracks and scat reports, one report of howling), and 23 from the east zone (14 sighting reports, eight track reports, one report of howling). Western/eastern wolf management zones are divided by highways 97/20/395.

ODFW conducted three wolf depredation investigations during the month in Wallowa County. Two investigations at the same ranch resulted in ODFW confirmation of wolf depredation by the Imnaha pack. One investigation resulted in a possible/unknown determination.

On Nov. 15, the Oregon Court of Appeals extended the stay prohibiting ODFW from killing two wolves from the Imnaha pack under the chronic depredation rule. ODFW's planned lethal removal of the alpha male and an uncollared wolf from the pack

is on hold pending the Court of Appeal's decision on the case.

Ten scat samples were collected from the newly discovered Snake River pack in October. Upon analysis, three individuals (all males) were identified. Two individuals are full siblings and are not related to any other Oregon wolves sampled so far. The third individual is unrelated to the siblings and has a half-sibling relationship to the three members of the Wenaha pack that have been analyzed. In July, a scat sample was collected in the western part of the Mt. Emily unit. The scat was identified as a female wolf and is unrelated to any Oregon wolves sampled to date. Tissue samples were collected from the two Walla Walla pack pups collared in October. The two pups are full siblings and are not related to any other Oregon wolves sampled so far. This is conclusive information that the Walla Walla and Wenaha packs are separate.
