Subsequent to the election, it was determined that the language "If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of sections 11 and 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution" was improperly omitted from the Question section of the ballot title. This language is required to be in the Question section by ORS 250.037. The required language was included in the Summary section of the ballot title.

ANY INTERESTED PERSON SEEKING TO CONTEST THE VALIDITY OF THE PROCEEDING OR THE ACTS OR THINGS ENUMERATED IN THE PROCEEDING must appear in Morrow County Circuit Court before the expiration of 10 days after the last date of publication of this notice. If no party appears within 10 days of the last date of publication, the Town of Lexington will apply to the above entitled Court for the relief prayed for in the Petition, to wit: Declaring the General Obligation Bond Authorization Measure 25-59 presented to the voters on November 8, 2011 and the results therefrom as regular and legal

In this event, the Vogue basic design V8598 blouse pattern is the only requirement.

The Quilt Department challenge requires entrants to make the "Shoo-Fly Doll Quilt" from the book, "The Civil War Sewing Circle," by Kathleen Tracy. Martingale Publishers is permitting 100 copies of the instructions and historical data to be printed for personal use of the quilters.

The Vogue pattern is available in town at Sew On Et Cetera for \$1. Vogue was kind enough to sell 25 patterns in various sizes at this low price.

Very few rules are in place for this challenge, allowing plenty of room for individuality and creativity in each quilt. Any combination of fabrics and embellishments are encouraged, but each quilt must be made following the directions in the printed instructions. The finished doll quilt is 22"X27" and is designed with a simple and richly historical block. Call Peggy Fishburn at 676-5246 or Cynthia Wenberg at 676-5036 for a copy of the printed instructions and requirements.

Any fabric or combination of fabrics, any enhancements and personal touches, are encouraged. Set-in sleeves can be altered, overall length can be changed and front closure can be modified, but all other sewing directions are to be used in construction of this blouse. Sewers can make this blouse in any size, as fitting is not part of this challenge.

The Clothing Department challenge is similar to the quilt challenge.

Marlene Pointer will be at her shop ready to sell the pattern and discuss the rules with everyone, or participants can call her at 676-5556.

Both of these challenges have categories for all age groups and sewing levels. Quilter's Roundup, also has copies of the book, the pattern and all the rules, so they are ready to assist when needed.
