Chamber lunch meeting

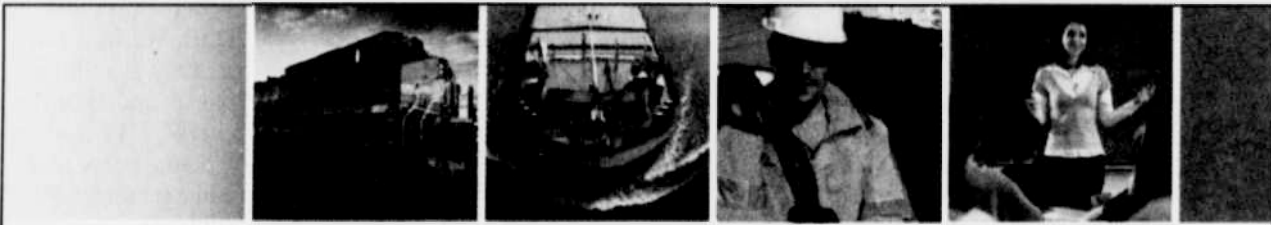

The Morrow Pacific project will ship Powder River Basin coal to the Port of Morrow by train. From there, barges will move the coal to the Port of St. Helens, where it will be transferred to oceangoing vessels bound for U.S. trade allies such as Japan, South Korea and Taiwan.
