Notice of Preliminary Determination for Water Right Transfer T-10269
T-10269 filed by the PORT OF MORROW, PO BOX 200, BOARDMAN, OR 97818, proposes a change in place of use, character of use, and to add five new additional wells under Certificate 51822. The right allows the use of 4.46 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND (priority date DECEMBER 1, 1971) from Wells 16 (Sec. 12)

and Well 17 (Sec 2), within T4N, R25E, W.M. (Columbia River Basin) for IRRIGATION in Sections 1, 2, 11 and 12. The applicant proposes to add five additional wells, being the three EB Wells within Sec. 2, T4N, R25E, W.M., located approximately 1 1/4 mile northwest from Well 16, approximately 1600 feet northwest from Well 17; and being the PDX1 and DLB1 wells within Sec. 2, T4N, R25E, W.M., located approximately 1/2 mile east from Well 16, and 1 1/2 miles east from Well 17 within, and, to change the place of use and character of use to Municipal use within the service area boundary of the Port of Morrow. The Water Resources Department has concluded that the proposed transfer appears to be consistent with the requirements of ORS Chapter 540 and OAR 690-380-5000. Any person may file, jointly or severally, with the Department a protest or standing statement within

30 days after the date of final publication of notice in the Department's weekly notice or of this newspaper notice, whichever is later. 'Roots of Music' performance set for Heppner

A unique concert featuring international music and more than 25 authentic, unusual instruments will be held on Thursday, April 26, at 7 p.m. at the Heppner Elementary School.

Under the title, "The Living Roots of Music," internationally-acclaimed musician Lauren Pelon traces the story of music and performs music from around the world on lute, guitar, lute-guitar, lyre, recorders, gemshorns, cornamuse, krummhorn, schreierpfeife, shawm, rackets, pennywhistles, concertina, ocarina, hurdy-gurdy, doucaine, Kiowa courting flute, synthesizers, electric wind instrument and pedal board. Pelon is also a vocalist, and her original songs and ancient ballads have been appealing to audiences of all ages.

Pelon was the recipient of a 2001 Artist of the Year award from the

Minnesota Arts Council, and 2010 Artist Initiative Award from the Minnesota State Arts Board. She has presented concerts throughout the United States, Canada, Europe, Australia and Asia. She has also performed as a soloist with symphony orchestras, on television specials and on Garrison Keillor's "A Prairie Home Companion."

"I'm fascinated by the interesting ways people of other cultures and different times have found to make music," says Pelon. "I especially enjoy doing these programs because they differ from ordinary concert performances."

"The programs offer not only an opportunity to listen to music, but also a way to think about how music has affected the lives of people all over the world...from ancient times to today."
