## DA's Report

Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson has released the following report:  
-Joel Ernesto Rodriguez, 26, was convicted of Felon Possess Firearm, a Class C felony, and was sentenced to 15 months incarceration with the Oregon Department of Corrections, with credit for time served.

He was also given two years post-prison supervision.  
Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$728.  
-Jorge Alvarez Rivera, 32, was convicted of Possession of Methamphetamine, a Class C felony, and sentenced to 22 months incarceration with the Oregon Department of Corrections, with credit for time served.

The defendant's driver's license was also suspended, and the defendant sentenced to two years post-prison supervision.  
Total fines, fees and assessments were \$208.  
-Albert Ronald Burgess, 62, was convicted of DUII, a Class A misdemeanor, and Reckless Driving, a Class A misdemeanor.

The defendant's driver's license was suspended for life.  
Of 180 days jail time for each count—360 days total—320 days were suspended and the subject given five years bench probation under each count.  
Probation conditions included 260 hours of community service.  
Total fines, fees and assessments were \$2,706.
