

Price Academic All-American

Heppner native Erin Price, sophomore at Taylor University in Upland IN, was recently recognized as a Capital One Academic All-American.

Price, who received the honor for her performance in women's track/cross country, was one of 20 Taylor University student-athletes who received the honor, giving the school more Academic All-Americans than any other school in the country at any level. The small university, which has approximately 1,900 students, beat out academic powerhouses like Stanford and Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), which each had only 12 Academic All-Americans, John Hopkins, which had 10, and Duke, with nine.

Eleven of Taylor's 15 sports were represented among the 20 honorees with an even split of male and female recipients. The sports of football, volleyball, women's track, and women's cross country led

the way with three from each team being recognized. Seven different student-athletes were named to the first team with six on the second team and seven more were named third team Academic All-Americans. Price was named to the third team.

The award-winners in each sport are selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). Criteria for being voted to one of the Capital One Academic All-America teams include a student-athlete's combined performances in the classroom and on the field of play.

To be eligible for Academic All-America consideration, student-athletes must be varsity starters or key reserves, maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.30 on a scale of 4.00, have reached sophomore athletic and academic standings at their current institutions and be nominated by their sports information directors.
