

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office reports handling the following business:

May 9: -BPD received a call from a man who advised that for the last two weeks there was a dog behind his house that barks day and night and he needs it to stop.

-MCSO was advised that Oregon State Police arrested Gary Lynn Ball on a Morrow County Circuit Court warrant for criminally negligent homicide. The subject was lodged at Umatilla County Jail.

-MCSO arrested Michelle A Stephens, 39, on a Marion County Circuit Court warrant for contempt of court. Subject was also arrested on a Hermiston Municipal Court warrant for failure to appear on theft III. Subject was lodged at Umatilla County Jail.

-MCSO arrested Roberto Navarro Medina, 46, for DUII bac .23. Subject was cited and released to appear.
