"Country pride, county-wide" describes not only the Morrow County Fair 2012 but also the *Morrow County Chronicles 2012*. Of course, the *Chronicles* will be for sale at the fair again this year.

The first story in this year's collection of historical articles features Samuel H. Boardman, the man after whom the community on the banks of the Columbia is named. Boardman's influence extended beyond Morrow County, through his concern for the state's natural beauty, and included his serving as an administrator of the Oregon State Parks Department.

The last of the 16 articles in this edition of the *Chronicles* takes the reader up into the mountains in the southern part of the county, to the "Linger Longer" Guard Station. Between those two stories, details abound about other county residents, about Morrow County sheriffs, about military veterans, and about early farming methods and the coming of electricity to our rural areas. The 2012 issue of the *Chronicles* is truly an example of country pride, and it certainly holds county-wide appeal.
