Boardman park gets new picnic pavilion

The Boardman City Park has had a makeover of sorts. The park still boasts great baseball fields and a fun playground, but gone is the old wood-shingled gazebo, replaced by a new 24-foot by 40-foot picnic pavilion.

The pavilion was constructed by Cleary Building Corporation and completed in July. It offers plenty of picnic space, with many picnic tables. There are also electrical outlets and automatic lighting. The pavilion, combined with the nearby restrooms, makes the Boardman City Park the ideal location for any large gatherings such as parties or reunions.

The city anticipates the new picnic pavilion will

be in high demand, mostly during the summer months, so reservations will be necessary. Individuals wanting to reserve the picnic pavilion can do so by calling the Park and Recreation District at 541-481-7217. A \$25 fee will be required for the reservation and a \$40 cleaning fee will be assessed if the pavilion and surrounding area are not left in an orderly state. Two weeks notice is required when canceling the pavilion to receive a refund. As a reminder, no glass is allowed in the city park at any time, and no bands, DJs or loud music will be permitted.

City staff says they hope the picnic pavilion will be enjoyed by everyone for many years to come.
