-Continued from PAGE ONE suggesting CFIUS and the military are concerned the Chinese government would somehow embed monitoring devices into the wind towers to listen to the electronics and other airplane activity at the bombing range.

The Navy sends pilots from Whidbey Island in Washington to train at the Boardman range. Whidbey Island is the premier naval aviation installation in the Pacific Northwest, and home of all Navy tactical electronic attack squadrons flying the EA-6B Prowler and EA-18G Growler aircraft.

Other background information obtained by the Gazette on the project says that Sany currently has all legal permits to construct the project and already has

spent more than \$10 million relying on the permits. The Federal Aviation Administration reportedly okayed permits for the project and, as part of the FFA process, the Department of Defense determined that the site did not threaten national security.

Furthermore, the Gazette-Times has learned that, because of the cease and desist order from CFIUS, Sany has agreed to sell the project to U.S. citizens and has asked for a 60-day extension under which Sany would sell the project within 60 days to a U.S. citizen and, if not, it would then cease construction. CFIUS reportedly refused the extension request, a move which is putting the project developers under stress to meet financing and

construction obligations. Sany has reportedly been in negotiations with investment bankers who are American citizens and had reportedly reached a verbal agreement to sell the project to resolve the issue of foreign ownership. Before a written contract was finalized, however, CFIUS expanded their interim cease-and-desist order to require that Sany equipment cannot be installed on the property and used for the wind farms.

"By law, information filed with CFIUS may not be disclosed by CFIUS to the public. Accordingly, the Department does not comment on information relating to specific CFIUS cases, including whether or not certain parties have filed notices for review."

Changes made to FSA 2012 tax reporting

Changes to Form 1099-G and 1099-MISC for FSA producers and vendors

Calendar year 2012 brings several changes to the way FSA reports a producer's farm program payments to the producer and to IRS, Morrow County Farm Service Agency (FSA) Executive Director Kyle Carnine announced this week.

In past years, IRS Forms 1099-G would be issued to show all program payments received from the FSA, regardless of the amount.

"Starting with calendar year 2012, producers whose total reportable payments from FSA are less than

\$600 will not receive IRS Form 1099-G (Report of Payments to Producers)," said Carnine. Additionally, producers who receive payments from more than one county will only receive one 1099-G if the total of all payments from all counties is \$600 or more, Carnine said.

"Producers who receive less than \$600 in combined payments should consult a tax advisor to determine if these payments must be reported on their tax return," she said.

If the payments were subject to voluntary withholdings or subject to backup (involuntary) withholdings, a 1099-G will be issued regardless of the total amount of the payments, Carnine said.

The same changes will apply to producers and vendors who normally receive IRS Form 1099-MISC from FSA.
