The following shall be the ballot title of the measure to be submitted to the district's voters:

FOUR-YEAR LOCAL OPTION LEVY RENEWAL FOR VECTOR (MOSQUITO) CONTROL.
Question 20 words
Shall the District impose \$.10 per \$1,000 of assessed value for mosquito control operations for four years beginning 2013-14? This measure may cause property taxes to increase more than 3 percent.
Summary 175 words

The North Morrow Vector Control District will use the tax revenue from this measure to provide improvements to general operations, including the following:
• Improve response to West Nile Virus or other mosquito-borne disease.
• Utilization of aircraft for mosquito control operations.
• Improved outreach programs and public education efforts.
• Increased utilization of available technology for mosquito control operations.
• Vehicle and equipment replacement.

The proposed levy will raise approximately \$77,000 annually over 4 years for a total of \$308,000. This estimate is based on the best available information from the Morrow County Assessor, and is an ESTIMATE ONLY. This levy would cost the owner of a home with an assessed value of \$100,000, \$10.00 per year. This option levy is not a new tax increase but a continuation of the prior option levy.
