## Creation scientists to speak in Heppner

Two speakers for creation science will be in Heppner this month.

Dr. Gary Parker will be speaking to the AWANA Club Thursday, Sept. 27, at 6:30 p.m. Parker is a paleontologist, biologist, educator, speaker and author. He taught and promoted evolution for years. He says eventually became convinced that the scientific evidence strongly favors creation, not evolution. Parker was a faculty member of the Institute for Creation Research (ICR) for 12 years and is currently a senior lecturer traveling with Ken Ham and Answers in Genesis. Parents and other interested people are invited to attend. Parker will be speaking to the Baptist youth group af-

ter the AWANA meeting. Spike Psarris will be the guest speaker at the Heppner Christian Church's annual Harvest Festival on Sunday, Sept. 30. Psarris is a former engineer from the U.S. military space program. He went into that program as an atheist and committed evolutionist and came

out of it as a young-earth creationist and Christian. Spike has a unique way of explaining complex topics in astronomy and making them easy to understand. The banquet starts at 6 p.m. Anyone who hasn't been invited and wants to come can call any member of the Heppner Christian Church

and get an invitation. These creation scientists are in the Pacific Northwest for Calvary Chapel's All School Creation Science Assemblies, Sept. 26-28, and the X Convention, Sept. 29, in Kennewick, WA. These events are open to the public.
