NRCS announces funding for private forest landowners

Non-industrial private forest landowners located in the Blakes Ranch and Penland Lake areas can apply for financial assistance to help protect their property from the threat of wildfire and increase overall forest health. Property owners interested in financial and technical assistance for conservation measures on their forestlands have until Oct. 31 to apply for Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) funding for federal fiscal year 2013.

"EQIP is a voluntary conservation program that offers financial assistance to landowners to improve and enhance the condition of water, soil, wildlife habitat and other natural resources on their private working lands," says Kacey Lathrop, NRCS District Conservationist.

The USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) accepts applications for EQIP year-

round. Funding decisions, however, are made at cutoff points during the year, with the current ranking period closing on Oct. 31 for Morrow County.

Applications that address local conservation priorities are evaluated and ranked for funding. The number of applications accepted will be based on ranking and available funding. Conservation priorities in Morrow County for the Blakes Ranch and Penland Lake areas include practices such as thinning and slash treatment.

Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson has released the following report:

-Sonny James Phipps, 26, was found guilty of probation violation; probation was revoked and the defendant given 2 months prison time with 12 months post-prison supervision and no credit for time served. The sentence is to run concurrent with another sentence.

-Sonny James Phipps, 26, was found guilty to one count of possession of methamphetamine, a Class C felony, and sentenced to 90 days jail time with credit for time served and one year post-prison supervision. The defendant's drivers license was also suspended for six months. Total fines, fees and assess-

ments were \$530. -Brian Lee Ironbear, 41, was found guilty of one count each of resisting arrest, a Class A misdemeanor, and harassment, a class B misdemeanor. For the first count, 150 days of 180 days jail time was suspended and the defendant given 30 days jail time with credit for time served and 36 months bench probation; probation included alcohol evaluation and 60 hours community service. For the second count, 90 days jail time was suspended and the defendant sentenced to 36 months bench probation; probation conditions included a written apology to the victim and 20 hours community service. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$940.

In 2010, he succeeded in getting all 90 of the Oregon legislators to disclose their PERS membership status. That had never been done before.

Re currently has a lawsuit pending in the Oregon Court of Appeals in which he is challenging the right of judges who are PERS members to decide PERS cases.

Buehler says he believes in using his position as head of the Corporation Division to actively seek new businesses and employers for Oregon, and to assist them with navigating government red tape. Buehler invites the public to come and ask questions about his candidacy.
