School's flooding problems. He said that they anticipate that the work will be completed by the end of February.

In other business, the board:  
-learned that three school board positions will be open for the May 21 election: position Number 2, now held by Thad Killingbeck; position Number 6, now held by Barney Lindsay; and position Number 7, now held by Dagoberto Hernandez. Filing for those positions opens Feb. 9. The filing deadline is March 21.

-learned from Dirksen that work is continuing on the district's achievement compact (the governor's mandated goals for each district). He said that recommendations for the district's achievement compact will be brought before the board at a work session on Monday, Jan. 28, at 6 p.m. at the district office. He also said that he expects that the achievement compact will tie in with board goals as they have been for the past several years.

-heard information from Assistant Superintendent George Mendoza about how the district is in the process of gearing up to meet the governor's all-encompassing birth-to-college education plan. He said that the district plans to begin conversations not only with public preschools, but also private preschools and child care providers with the goal of getting students ready for kindergarten. Dirksen said that preparing children to pass the third-grade benchmark tests is another goal. He added that, toward these goals, the district already has "migrant preschools and Head Start in our schools." Ultimately, plans are to monitor all kids, not only from birth, but prenatally, to try to find out which kids are at risk in order to put interventions in place. State funding for these all-expansive plans has not yet been determined.  
"It's a work in progress right now," said Dirksen. "We can't say what's going to happen."  
-heard a presentation from Irrigon Elementary grade-five teachers on student instruction, testing, tracking and assessment.  
-approved new/revised, rescinded policies on teacher evaluation, student transportation, use of district

vehicles for student transportation, student conduct on school buses, criminal records checks/fingerprinting, staff evaluation and an assessment program.

-approved adopting/rescinding administrative regulations: administrative standards, criminal records checks/fingerprinting, core teaching standards, and reimbursable school meals and milk programs.

-approved the first reading of rescinding and replacing professional development policies.

-received praise from Dirksen and the Morrow County Education Association and heard a declaration by Governor Kitzhaber in honor of school board recognition month.

-named Becky Kindle and Bill Kuhn to the li-

censed bargaining team for 2013, with Barney Lindsay as alternate, and Thad Killingbeck and Barney Lindsay to the classified bargaining team, with Brian Kollman as alternate.

-approved a resolution to accepted \$5,000 in unanticipated revenue for Sam Boardman Elementary from a donation from the Oregon Community Foundation. The funds went to support services.

-heard the following announcements: beginning of second semester, Jan. 14; Martin Luther King, Jr. Day holiday, Monday, Jan. 21, no school; safety meeting with law enforcement, Wednesday, Jan. 23; next board meeting, Heppner Elementary, Monday, Feb. 11, 7 p.m.
