Dogs must be leashed in Boardman

The City of Boardman Code Compliance Department wants to remind pet owners of the need to keep their dogs on a leash when away from home. Leash laws require dogs to be on a leash and under control whenever they're off their owners' property. This is done for the safety of the pet as well as the safety of others. Boardman code compliance, wants to ensure the health and welfare of all animals, and the citizens of Boardman. A dog running

loose can be picked up and impounded. The owner will be charged for the cost of impounding the dog. If the dog is unlicensed, the owner will be required to buy a license and will need to provide proof of rabies vaccination. If the dog is unvaccinated, the owner will have to pay for the vaccination before their dog can be released. Bernard E. "Bud" Marshall

Bernard E. "Bud" Marshall, 85 of Milwaukie, Oregon formerly of Heppner, died Saturday, March 16, 2013 at his home. Memorial Funeral Mass was held 2 p.m. Friday, March 22, at St. Patrick Catholic Church in Heppner, with a Memorial Graveside service following at 3:30 p.m. at the Lexington Cemetery, Lexington, Oregon.

Bud was born February 19, 1928 at Coeur d'Alene, Idaho the son of Kenneth and Myrtle Duncan Marshall.

He was raised and attended school in Lexington, Oregon and on September 18, 1945 he joined the Navy and served until February 16, 1949. Bud was a Machinist Mate First Class, and was assigned to five different ships and served a short tour in San Diego. He received the World War II Victory Medal, Asia-Pacific Campaign Medal and Good Conduct Medal.

On February 4, 1950 Bud married Roxie Ramona McDaniel at Pendleton, Oregon. The couple raised five children in the Heppner community, actively attending all of their sports events and concerts. In the 1970's Ramona had to go on a kidney dialysis machine and Bud trained to take care of her. He worked for Columbia Basin Electric Co-op while living in Heppner; he retired from there in 1989. In 1991 Bud and Ramona moved to Vancouver, Washington to be closer to Ramona's medical care. Ramona predeceased Bud on January 8, 1992.

Bud was a member of the following Catholic Church's: St. Patrick

Catholic Church in Heppner, Oregon, St. Joseph Catholic Church in Vancouver, Washington, and Our Lady of Grace in Beverly Hills, Florida. He became a member of the Knights of Columbus while living in Vancouver.

After Ramona's death Bud met Agnes Hill-Hordeman. They both had lost spouses thru illness, they both were Catholic and they

both had 5 children. They were married October 31, 1992. They loved to tell people they had 10 children. In 2000 they moved to Beverly Hills, Florida, and in 2012 they moved to Milwaukie, Oregon. Bud was very fond of his cat "Tiger Lilly" who came with them from Florida.

Survivors include his wife Agnes, his children Mona Lisa Pelesky and her husband Bill of Westport, Washington, Barney Marshall and his wife Susy of LaGrande, Oregon, Jeff Marshall of Long Beach, Washington, Dan Marshall of Lexington, Oregon, Kathy "Kate" Marshall of Fairbanks, Alaska, stepchildren Phyllis and Larry Fritzie of Oregon City, Oregon, Kim and Allisa Hordeman of Dunnellon, Florida, Henry Hordeman of Gainesville, Florida, Gary Hordeman, and Rex and Lisa Hordeman all of New Jersey, 21 grandchildren, 17 great grandchildren and 3 great great grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his wife Ramona, his parents, 2 sisters, 1 niece and 1 nephew. Memorial contributions may be made the donor's charity of choice. Sweeney Mortuary of Heppner is in charge of local arrangements.

both a UTAH CFP and also for an Oregon Concealed Handgun License. The Utah permit is good in over 30 states, including Washington. Fee is \$80 per student for both certifications and that fee also includes the photo, fingerprints and mail service to Utah.
