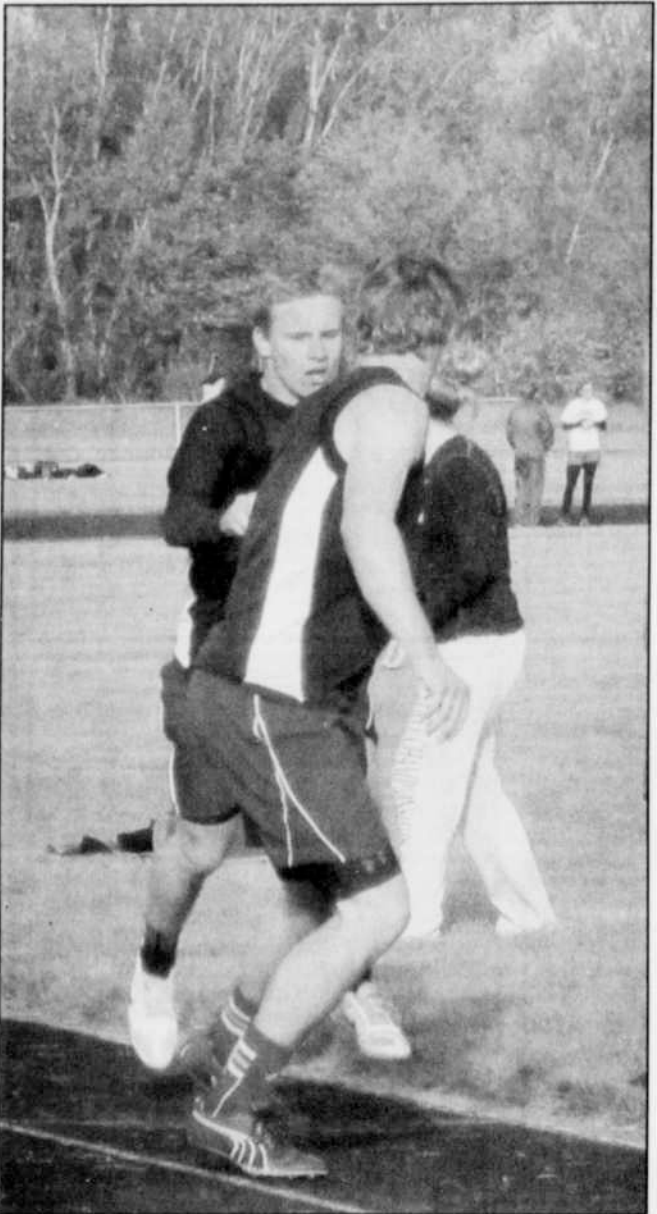




RJ Skaggs runs the 110 hurdles for Ione.

Arena action will feature the traditional rodeo events, including bull riding and ranch bronc riding. There will be added

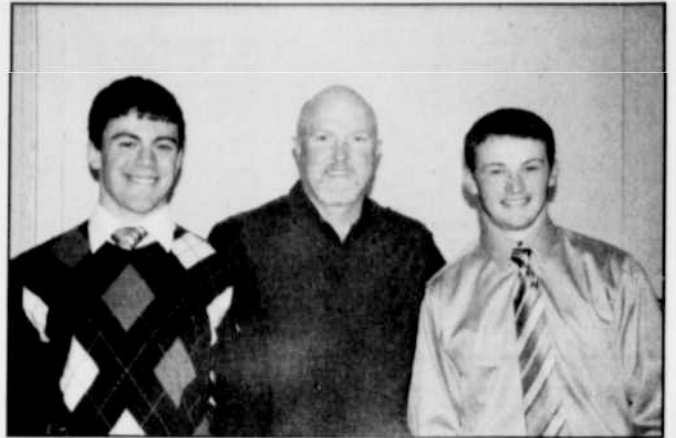

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office reports handling the following business:

-MCSO arrested Richard Dennis Balentine, 25, on a Wasco County Circuit Court warrant for Probation Violation. He was lodged at Umatilla County Jail with no bail.

-MCSO received report from a walk-in subject in Heppner of suspicious text messages she had received from an unknown person.

-MCSO received report of a motorcycle stolen from an Irrigon residence. The caller said he was at the residence two days earlier and the bike was there, however his ex-wife said it

was not there. -MCSO received report from an Irrigon man that the neighbors were playing karaoke very loud with big speakers and an open door. The caller advised MCSO to come in the long way, from California, so the neighbors couldn't see.

-MCSO received report of a Chevy Blazer on Homestead lane. The caller said there were no people in the vehicle, but they could be out in the field, where they have been having trouble.

-MCSO received request from a Boardman woman for a crisis worker. Information was relayed to Community Counseling Solutions.

-MCSO received report from a bus driver in Irrigon that a man took a drink of some type of clear liquid alcohol and put the bottle on the floor board of the passenger side of the vehicle, a silver Toyota Camry parked in front of the bus. He was lodged at Umatilla County Jail with \$43,000 bail.
