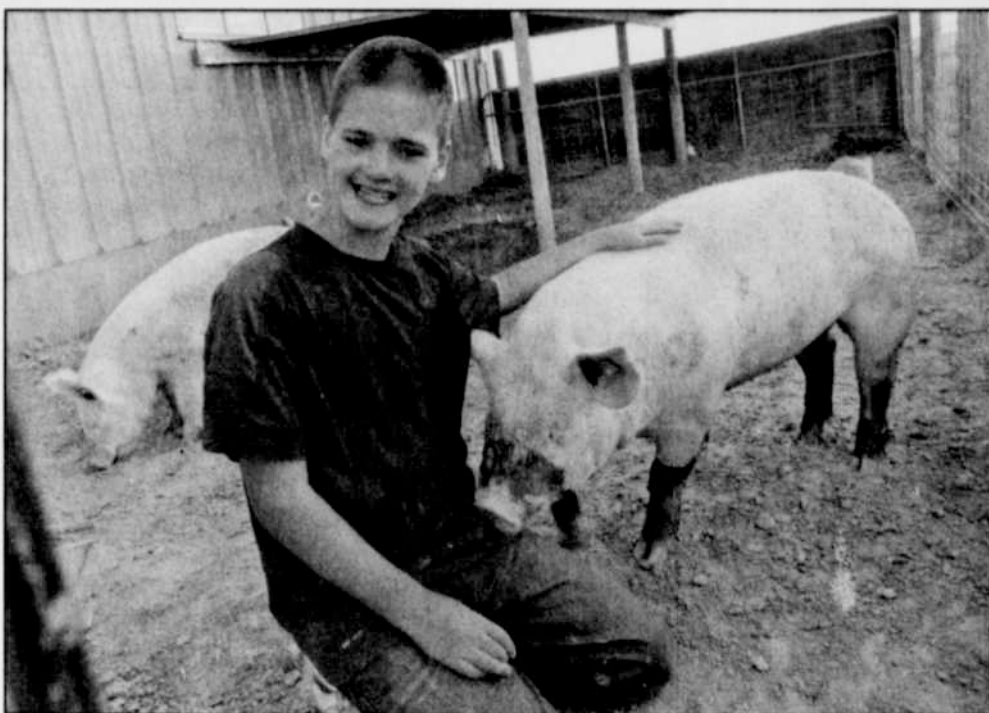
well-building mission trip to Guatemala in December.

Commission unanimously adopts new wolf rules

SALEM, Ore.—The Fish and Wildlife Commission adopted new permanent Oregon Administrative Rules to manage wolves in Oregon when it met by phone recently. The new rules are based on agreements reached between ODFW, Oregon Wild, Cascadia Wildlands and the Oregon Cattlemen's Association through settlement of a lawsuit.

The new rules can be found online and make the following key changes:

-Before ODFW can use lethal control against

wolves, it must confirm four qualifying incidents within a six-month time frame (previously it was two depredation incidents and no specific timeframe).

-Require agency coordination with a wider array of interests once wolf activity is known in an area.

-Require the development and public disclosure of area-specific wolf-livestock conflict deterrence plans that identify non-lethal measures to minimize conflict.

-Require that non-lethal measures be implemented

prior to a depredation for the depredation incident to count towards lethal control.

The livestock section of ODFW's wolf webpage has already incorporated many of the changes. Livestock producers should call ODFW's NE Region office (541-963-2138) or their local office if they have questions about the new rules.

The Commission is the policy-making body for fish and wildlife issues in Oregon. It usually meets monthly. The next meeting is Aug. 2 in Eugene.

DA's Report

Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson has released the following report:

-Daniel Albert Bozarth, 53, was convicted of one count of Disorderly Conduct II, a Class B misdemeanor, and sentenced to two years bench probation, to include enrollment in services with Community Counseling solutions and compliance with other probation or conditions of post-prison supervision. Bozarth was additionally convicted of one count of Criminal Mischief III, a Class C misdemeanor, and sentenced to two years bench probation, to include enrollment in services with Community Counseling solutions and compliance with other probation or conditions of post-prison supervision. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$200.

-Adrian Lee Ahumada, 29, was convicted of Failure to Appear II, a Class A misdemeanor. Sentence of

180 days jail time was suspended and the defendant sentenced to 18 months bench probation, to include 30 hours community service, no offensive physical contact with the victim and a mental health evaluation. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$480.

-Anthony Michael Shroul, 32, was convicted of Criminal Driving While Suspended or Revoked, a Class A misdemeanor. Sentence of 180 days jail time was suspended and the defendant sentenced to 24 months bench probation, to include 60 hours community service. Total fines, fees and assessments were \$440. Shroul was further found guilty of Failure to Appear II, a Class A misdemeanor. Sentence of 180 days jail time was suspended and the defendant sentenced to 24 months bench probation, to include 20 hours community service. Total fines, fees and assessments were \$480.

Justice Court Report

Morrow County Justice of the Peace Ann Spicer has released the following Justice Court Report:

-Joshua Kenneth Herzig, 30, of Heppner, was found guilty of Violating the Basic Rule (VBR) 82/55 and fined \$260.

-James E. Holtz, 40, of Lone, was convicted of Maintaining Dog as a Public Nuisance and fined \$260.

-Tasha Hollis, 29, of Heppner, pled no contest to VBR 85/55 and was fined \$260.

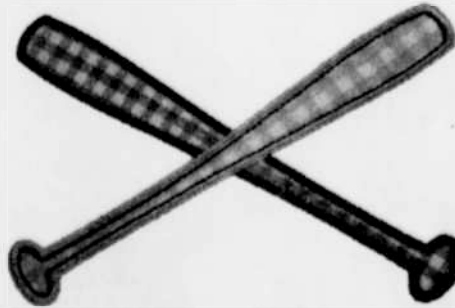

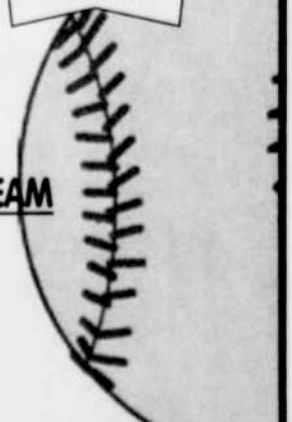
