

**Sheriff's Report**

**June 9:** Morrow County Sheriff's Office received report of people around a pickup on Hwy. 74 in Heppner. It turned out to be a disabled vehicle.

-MCSO received report of a black Lab mix, Buddy, lost in Irrigon.

-MCSO received report of an 80-year old male, semi-conscious, with a possible stroke in Irrigon. He was transported.

-MCSO received report that a subject who lives in the Oasis RV Park in Irrigon, who had just gotten picked up for hit and run and driving while suspended, still driving, but using a different vehicle.

-MCSO received a 911 hang-up call from an Irrigon address. On call back, it was determined that it was a 15-year-old who called by mistake. MCSO spoke with the teen's father who said his son was "basically grounded and is unhappy with the restrictions."

-MCSO deputy advised he was out helping a couple change a tire.

-MCSO received report of a two-tone 90s van all over the road with the driver possibly intoxicated on I-84 Boardman.

-MCSO received report for an incident concerning a dog complaint in Lone.

-MCSO, OSP received report of a broken down tan suburban on I-84 Boardman. The adults were attempting to fix it, but the children were attempting to flag down passers-by and were creating a hazard. There were also personal items on the fog line. OSP did not have anyone available.
