your dedication to your community and your participation in outdoor activities and the shooting sports," he stated in the letter.

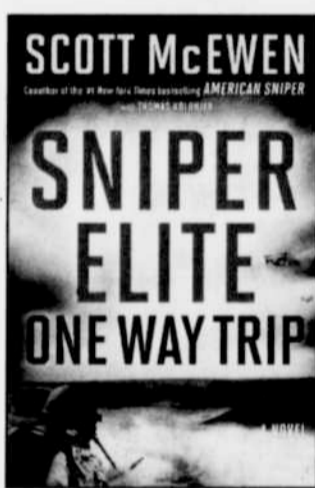

## American Sniper co-author to appear in Pendleton book signing

Those who have been following the buzz about Heppner native Scott McEwen's writing career will now have the chance to meet the local author at a book signing Saturday, Sept. 14, at 10:30 a.m. at Armchair Books, 39 SW Dorion Avenue, Pendleton.

McEwen will be signing his new novel, Sniper Elite: One Way Trip. The inspired-by-true-events thriller follows one of America's most lethal snipers as he leads the rescue of a downed female special ops pilot. The book is now being developed into a movie by Ridley Scott (Gladiator, Black Hawk Down, Alien).

During the Sniper Elite signing, McEwen will discuss what our most elite and special ops soldiers are



facing overseas and at home daily, based on his many insider conversations with them; the fact that, though it's a novel, Sniper Elite is based on actual Black Ops missions; and how the novel demonstrates how our soldiers are driven by doing what is right, even if it's politically unfavorable.
