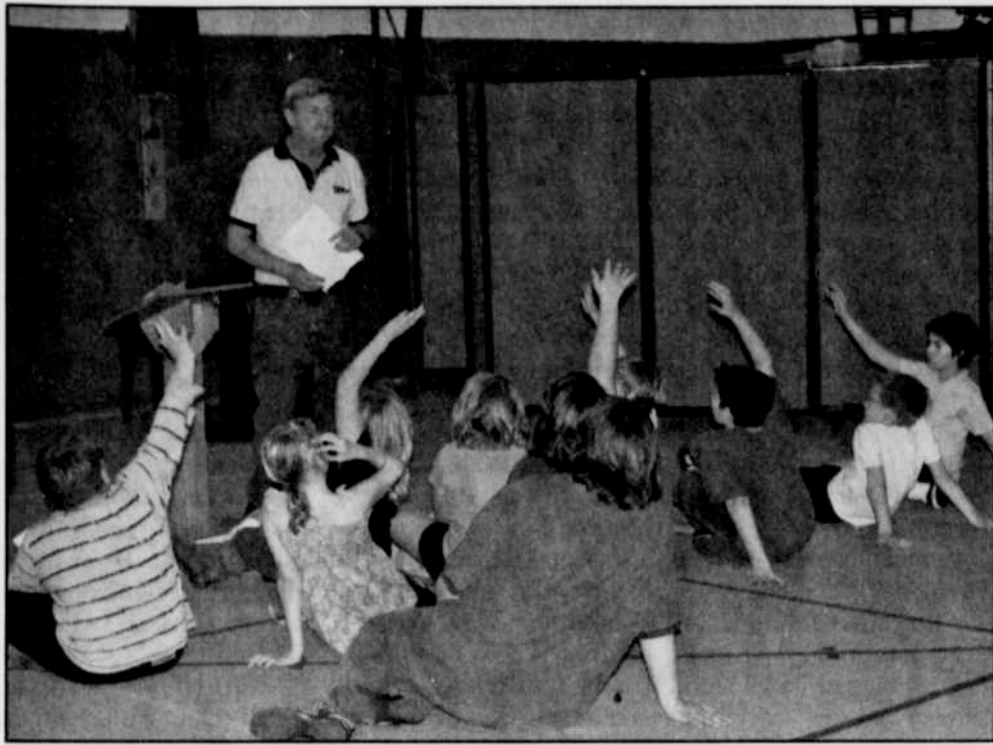


AWANA Club starts this Thursday
