

Sheriff's Report

July 31: MCSO received report from a Lexington man that an older Ford pickup went off the highway and drove through his property, driving through his driveway and between machinery before getting back on the highway and heading toward Hermiston.

-MCSO cited Shawn Ira Rule, 28, for Driving While Suspended.

-MCSO received report of a garbage truck spilling garbage all over the freeway on I-84 Boardman.

-MCSO received report that an employee at Columbia River Ranch destroyed some medications that should have been handed out to residents.

-MCSO received report from a subject at Morrow County Circuit Court that a subject had just called her, screaming and using profanity.

-MCSO received report of a problem with a mental subject in Heppner.
