

DA's Report

Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson has released the following report:

-Guadalupe Perez-Rubio, 50, was convicted of Criminal Trespass I, a Class A misdemeanor, and sentenced to 180 days jail time; however, 150 days jail time was suspended and the defendant sentenced to two years bench probation to include 30 days in jail, 20 hours of community service and no contact with the victim.

-Defendant was further convicted of Harrassment, a Class B misdemeanor, and sentenced to 90 days jail time; however, jail time was suspended and the defendant sentenced to two years bench probation. Further counts were disposed without conviction. Total fines, fees and assessments were \$970.

-Guadalupe Perez-Rubio was further convicted of three separate counts of Contempt of Court. On one of those counts, the defendant was sentenced to 24 months bench probation with fines, fees and assessments totaling \$380.
