August 16 (cont.): the previous night or early that morning and that several items were missing. Deputy responded and took report.

-A caller on I-84 near Boardman advised that a vehicle was passing other vehicles on the shoulder and driving erratically. MCSO was out of position; OSP was advised.

-A man in Heppner reported that a neighbor had parked a trailer on his property; he asked them for several days to move it and it is still there. He requested deputy contact.

-MCSO cited Romero Gilberto Martinez Cisneros, 21, for interfering with a police investigation; subject was released to appear at Irrigon Justice Court. MCSO also cited and release Jerry Micheal Smith Jr., 21, for DUII.

-MCSO was advised that Hermiston PD arrested Victor Landeros Jr. on a Morrow County warrant for Failure to Appear on Driving While Suspended and Unlawful Possession of Methamphetamine. Subject was lodged at Umatilla County Jail.
