

Sheriff's Report

August 9 (cont.):
-MCSO received a call with a male rambling and other loud sounds. On attempted call back, the phone went to voice mail. MCSO attempted to locate, but was unable to locate anything.

-MCSO received report from a bar in Heppner that a brown and white spotted dog keeps coming into the bar. MCSO responded and located the owner.

-MCSO received report of a burn barrel going at an Irrigon residence with an airplane sitting on the tower by the house. The subjects were warned to put the fire out, but didn't.
