David was born in Pendleton, OR on March 16, 1948 to Orval Matheny and Pauline Rauch Matheny. He grew up just outside of Heppner with sisters Sandy and Sally, where his passion for riding horses and love

of the outdoors began. He graduated from Heppner High School in 1966. He then attended Oregon State University, where he received a bachelor's degree and was a member of the OSU rodeo team.

David's family and the Lucianis were long-time family friends, but it wasn't until spring break of 1972 that David realized Patty Luciani was meant to be his wife. They married on November 16, 1974. David worked for Sandpiper Farms in Paterson, WA from 1974 to 1986. At that time, the couple returned to the family farm after the retirement of his father, where David assumed responsibilities as a dry-land wheat farmer through

his final days.

David was an avid supporter of the Heppner Booster Club, a longtime standing member of the Heppner Elks Lodge, a director on the Morrow County Grain Growers board, an active member of Trinity Lutheran Church of Hermiston, and an Oregon Wheat League member. He enjoyed farming, hunting, skiing, horseback riding in the Eagle Cap Wilderness, and watching his sons participate in Heppner athletics. Most recently, he cherished his time spent with his first grandson, Peyton David Matheny.
