

## Sheriff's Report

### September 3 (cont.):

-MCSO received report from Irrigon Justice Court that a subject had come into IJC to pay a fine for Driving While Suspended and then left in a red two-door vehicle. The subject was determined to be valid.

-MCSO reported that a Heppner man turned in 10 shotgun shells that were damaged and he did not want them to be shot.

-MCSO, Boardman Ambulance received report of a male lying about two feet off the rumble strip on I-84 Boardman taking a nap. MCSO responded and transported the subject to the rest area.

-MCSO received request for a welfare check from Umatilla County Sheriff's Office for a subject who was pulled over and cited in Stanfield. UCSO officer had heard the subject make a remark about killing himself. MCSO Deputy contacted the subject who said he was not serious, but was just trying to make the officer feel bad for citing him.

-Heppner Ambulance received report of an elderly female lying on the sidewalk in Heppner. The ambulance responded and transported her to Pioneer Memorial Hospital.

-Heppner Ambulance responded to transport a patient to and from the Pioneer Memorial Hospital helicopter landing site. Heppner Fire Department also responded.

**September 4:** MCSO received a third party report of smoke coming out of a silo at the Hwy. 206/207 Junction, Heppner. It wasn't a fire, but only dust.

-MCSO received report of an intoxicated subject in a white Toyota pickup driving the previous day in Heppner. The caller said it was starting to become an ongoing problem.

-MCSO cited Esmeralda Villa, for Violation of the Speed Limit, 83 mph in a 65 mph zone and No Operating License.

-MCSO Deputy advised he was at the Morrow County Courthouse in Heppner for court security.

-MCSO received report from a Lexington woman that a female who was staying at her residence stole a pickup and charged \$215 on her credit card.

-MCSO Undersheriff reported that he was out with a motor vehicle accident with one car on its side blocking one lane of Hwy. 207, Lexington, and an elderly female driver injured. MCSO, Heppner Ambulance, Heppner Fire, Ione Fire, Station 7, Oregon Department of Transportation, Oregon State Police and Life Flight responded. The patient

was transported to Kadlec Medical Center by Life Flight.

-MCSO received report from a lone woman that her puppy was tied up outside and barks when someone walks by and the neighbor man came over and screamed and yelled at her and shook his finger in her face about the puppy barking. A deputy made contact with both parties and a witness. The caller advised she was probably going to get rid of the puppy and the male subject was advised not to go onto other peoples' property yelling at them.

-MCSO received report from an Irrigon man that a subject in a purple car peeled out and was going past his residence just to make him mad. He wanted something done about this.

-MCSO received report of a combine on the freeway moving really slow on I-84, Boardman, and almost caused an accident.

-MCSO cited Hata Hill, 36, for Violation of the Basic Rule, 77 mph in a 55 mph zone.

-MCSO received report of a pit bull loose in Irrigon.

-MCSO received report of a young teenager in a red Honda that just about wiped out two cars in Irrigon. The caller said the driver was possibly a redhead.

-MCSO reported looking for a red vehicle going at high rates of speed in Boardman, possibly the vehicle in the previous entry.

-MCSO received request for a welfare check for a 15-year-old female who had marks on her from her step-dad. The girl advised that her mom just had surgery and was not doing well and the step dad refused to let her go to the hospital. The caller was concerned for her safety.

-Irrigon Ambulance received report of a subject who had been throwing up and then passed out. One male subject was transported to Good Shepherd Hospital.

**September 5:** Morrow County Sheriff's Deputy reported he was at the Morrow County Courthouse in Heppner for security during circuit court.

-MCSO received report of two aggressive pit bull mixes in Heppner. The caller said the dogs jumped over the fence and came after her dog while she was walking it. She reported that the owners came out, denied they were pit bulls and denied they were after her dog until the dogs lunged at her dog again in front of the owners.

-MCSO received report of a 64-year-old male in Lexington having trouble breathing. MCSO, Heppner Ambulance and Heppner

Fire Department responded. The subject was transported by ambulance to Pioneer Memorial Hospital.

-MCSO received report from a Heppner woman that a yellow Dodge truck with Washington plates at her house. MCSO responded and was unable to locate the vehicle.

-MCSO received report of a subject with a suspended driver's license driving on Sand Hollow Rd. MCSO responded and determined another subject was driving the vehicle.

-MCSO received report of high water on Hwy. 207, Lexington that was going across Baseline Rd.

-MCSO responded to a two vehicle motor vehicle accident in Boardman with little or no damage.

-MCSO received request to contact an on-call crisis worker. The caller was referred to Community Counseling Solutions.

-MCSO received report of a male subject threatening to harm himself in Irrigon. Deputies made contact and the subject was to meet with Community Counseling the next day.

-MCSO received report of neighbors who had been partying between two apartments in Heppner arguing. MCSO responded and determined it was a verbal disagreement only. The parties were separated for the night.

**September 6:** Morrow County Sheriff's Office

-MCSO arrested Joseph Arthur Manning, 27, on an Irrigon Justice Court warrant for Failure to Appear/Assault IV with \$1,879 bail in full and a Hermiston Municipal warrant for Disorderly Conduct and Contempt of Court with \$10,000 bail. He was lodged at Umatilla County Jail.

-MCSO received report of a domestic dispute in progress in Heppner with loud banging and a lot of yelling. The caller said he could not see over his high fence, but it sounded serious.

-MCSO received report of a Heppner Ambulance patient transport to Kadlec.

-MCSO received an anonymous report of a subject in Irrigon working on his semi truck and dumping oil on the ground.

-MCSO received report

from an Irrigon woman that she was selling items on Craig's List and believed she was contacted by someone trying to use a fraudulent credit card.

-MCSO received report from a man who said there was someone living in the basement of his mother's home that burned in 2010. The place has no running water or electricity. He said he did not know who it was but received a letter from friends advising him of this. He requested deputy contact and wanted the subjects removed from the property.

-MCSO received report of a driver who had just thrown a lit cigarette butt out of his pickup window on Hwy. 730 in Irrigon. Oregon State Police was advised.

-MCSO received report from a Heppner woman that a subject she has a restraining order against had just entered her residence and sat down. MCSO arrested Wade Merle Padberg, 56, on a Restraining Order violation. He was lodged at Umatilla County Jail with \$10,000 bail.

-MCSO received request for a courtesy ride into Lexington from a woman who was walking on a gravel road in the dark after a verbal argument with her boyfriend around 10:30 p.m. The woman then walked back to her home and advised she no longer needed a ride. A deputy made contact.

-Heppner Fire Department received report of an outbuilding that was being torn down on fire near the old Kinzua Mill site.

**September 7:** Morrow County Sheriff's Office received report from an Ione subject that another man was supposed to deliver 16 tons of hay to him last winter, but only delivered six tons. The caller said he had the cancelled check.

-MCSO received report from a Heppner woman that she received a fraudulent phone call regarding a virus on her computer. She said the subjects told her that if she paid them, they could fix the problem. The caller ID said "unknown". The woman said she confronted the caller and they hung up.

-MCSO received report from an Irrigon woman that she had money stolen from her out of her checking account using her card the previous week.

-MCSO received report of a 12 year-year-old female in Irrigon with a possible broken hip or leg from a skateboard accident.

-MCSO received report from Lakeview Heights that a resident was walking away from the facility down the highway from Willow Creek Lake, toward Heppner. They requested assistance in getting him back to the facility. MCSO transported the subject to Juniper Ridge.

-MCSO received request from a deputy using an Irrigon man that his nine-year-old son found someone's pellet gun and shot out two car windows of vehicles that belonged to someone else, but were being stored on the caller's property.

-MCSO received report from an Irrigon man of a party across the pasture with the music quite loud. MCSO responded and the music was turned down.

-MCSO received report from a Heppner woman of a man and woman coming to her home and offering Dish network packages. She said she thought it was a good deal and gave them personal information, but later changed her mind and

tried to find them, but they were gone. She was not sure what to do.

-MCSO received report from a woman in Texas saying that she was on the phone with her sister in Irrigon and heard her sister and her sister's boyfriend fighting and then heard a loud thud and the phone hit the ground. She said she could hear her sister crying in the background while the boyfriend was yelling.

-MCSO received request for deputy contact from an Irrigon woman concerning threatening text messages her daughter was receiving from two other females.

**September 8:** -A female in Irrigon called and advised that a male subject inside the house just punched her in the face; she didn't know his name, and she was outside in her car. Her sister went back inside to get the keys to her own vehicle. MCSO responded.

-David Lynn Hickox, 54, was arrested by MCSO for a restraining order violation and lodged at Umatilla County Jail.

-Clifford Eugene Bradley, 47, was arrested by MCSO for Driving While Suspended Misdemeanor and an Irrigon Justice Court warrant for Failure to Appear/Traffic Offense and lodged at Umatilla County Jail. Subject was also warned for disobeying a stop sign.

-Received a report of a motorcycle wreck toward Ukiah, three miles past Cutsforth Park; subject was conscious and breathing. MCSO, Heppner fire and Heppner ambulance responded; subject was transported to Pioneer Memorial Hospital.

-MCSO cited Julian Almonte Cadenas, 63, for Driving While Suspended Violation and Failure to Drive within Lane.

Woman called back and advised there was no need for a deputy to respond, they were going to work it out on their own.

Caller reported that the subject would pass him and motion to pull over and then pass but would then slow down so the caller would have to pass.
