Chamber lunch meeting

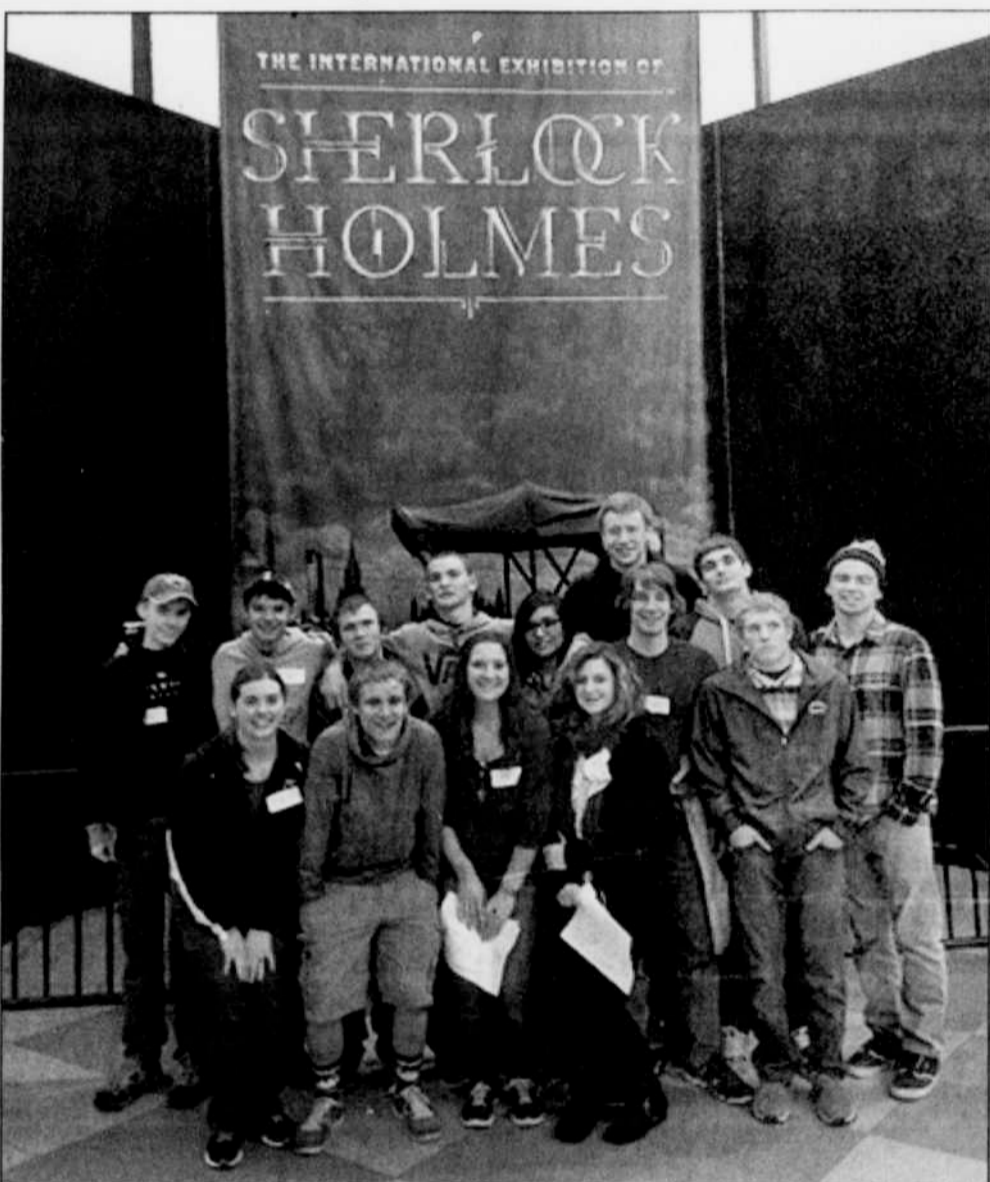
