Miki is the daughter of Randy and Sandy Frazier of Meridian. Justin is the son of Alan and Sheri Gregory of Heppner.

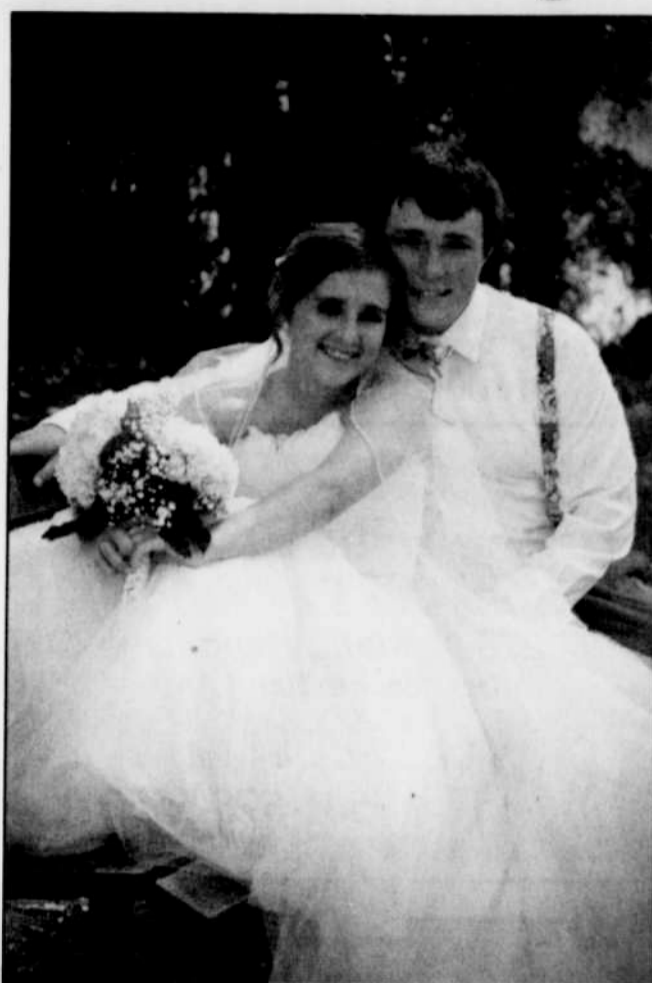
Miki is a 2006 graduate of Mountain View High School and 2009 graduate of Carrington College. Miki is currently employed as a
