

DA's Report

Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson has released the following report:

-Clifford Eugene Bradley, 47, was convicted of one count of Possession of Methamphetamine, a Class C felony. The defendant's license was suspended for six months and the defendant sentenced to 18 months supervised probation, subject to 90 sanction units and 30 jail units, to include substance abuse evaluation, mental health evaluation, and 60 hours of community service. Schwabrow was further convicted of one count of Criminal Driving While Suspended or Revoked, a Class A misdemeanor; sentence of 180 days jail time was suspended and the defendant sentenced to 24 months bench probation, to include 40 hours of community service. Additional counts were disposed without conviction. Total fines, fees and assessments were \$1,420.

-Wayne Bradley Schwabrow, 38, was convicted of one count of Possession of Marijuana,

a Class B felony. The defendant's driver's license was suspended for six months and the defendant sentenced to 18 months supervised probation, subject to 90 sanction units and 30 jail units, to include substance abuse evaluation, mental health evaluation, and 60 hours of community service. Schwabrow was further convicted of one count of Possession of Methamphetamine, a Class C felony. Fines, fees and

assessments totaled \$1,646. -Kaitlyn May Christman, 19, was convicted of Attempt to Commit a Class C/Unclassified Felony - Unauthorized Use of a Vehicle, a Class A misdemeanor. The defendant was sentenced to 180 days jail time, of which 165 days jail time were suspended and the defendant sentenced to 24 months bench probation. Conditions of probation included 60 hours of community service, a written apology to the victim, no direct or indirect contact with the victim, no contact with co-defendant Zachary Bartz, and cooperation with the prosecution of Zachary Bartz. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$880.

Sheriff's Report
