

## Sheriff's Report

### November 5 (cont.):

-Caller in Heppner requested contact because he was having difficulty finding the VIN on a 1967 Mustang. DMV came to his house and found the VIN.

-A caller in Irrigon reported their vehicle was broken into the night before. The only thing taken was about 40 CDs; left a hammer on the front seat. Caller would like contact after 4 p.m. Deputy responded and took report.

-MCSO cited Dawn Marie Winton, 32, for failure to obey traffic control device/stop light, no ops, driving uninsured, to appear in Hermiston Municipal Court.

-Umatilla County Sheriff's Office advised MCSO that a four wheeler was stolen from Townsend Rd. and someone saw a man in Irrigon riding it into his shop.

-A male brought a pair of boots into the sheriff's office; located the boots between his house and another outbuilding. Does not need contact, and has no idea who the boots belong to.

**November 6:** Morrow County Sheriff's Office received report from a Heppner man that his neighbor's cows are on his property at Blackhorse Canyon and Piper Canyon. The caller said he had just seeded and the cows were destroying it.

-MCSO received report of large sheep dogs on the road on Hwy. 207, Heppner. A deputy responded, but was unable to locate the dogs. MCSO received an additional report from a different caller that the dogs were on Hwy. 207 on the hill before you drop down into Ruggs.

-MCSO received report from Irrigon City Hall that a construction worker for the new library found a driver's license and insurance cars in a dumpster at the city.

-MCSO received report of a black Ford pickup with a trailer on the back on Hwy. 207, Lexington that had steam or smoke coming out of the engine. A deputy made contact and determined that the vehicle was off the road and contacts for help had been made.

-MCSO received report of a dead buck by the concession stand at the Hager Park in Heppner. ODFW was contacted and advised they would check it out.

-MCSO received report of juveniles messing with the caller's dogs in Irrigon.

-MCSO received report of a deer hit and lying on the white line on Hwy. 207 near Station 7/Echo. A deputy responded. The deer had already been dragged off the road.

-MCSO received report of a drive-off of \$6.14 of fuel from a black Ford F350. The caller said that the driver said he was going to the mountains hunting. A deputy responded and took the report.

-MCSO received report from a Boardman woman on Homestead Lane that she saw people out with flashlights and heard three shots, then saw a car going west on the county road. A deputy checked the area.

-Heppner Ambulance received report of an 83-year-old woman with severe diarrhea and vomiting.

-Boardman Ambulance received a request from Frontier Dispatch for mutual aid for a male subject at the Village Inn who was not feeling well. Boardman Ambulance did not respond because they had no spare crew.

### November 7:

Morrow County Sheriff's Office received report that Hermiston Police Department arrested Victor Flores Martinez, 35, for Criminal Trespass II, attempting to elude a police officer with a vehicle, four counts of reckless driving, being a felon in possession of a firearm, possession of a controlled substance - methamphetamine, unlawful possession of a restricted weapon, altering or obliterating an ID number on a firearm as well as a Umatilla County Circuit Court warrant. The subject was lodged at Umatilla County Jail with \$79,000 bail.

-MCSO advised a male subject he could not be driving on public roads with no license.

-MCSO received report from a Heppner woman that a Schwan's truck was parked in front of her driveway. She requested deputy contact because if she needed to get out she would not be able to and wanted the vehicle moved. When the deputy responded, no one was home.

-MCSO received report of a border collie named Cooler with two collars, one green and one bailing twine, lost in Heppner. The caller said that kids from the apartment on the hill always come down and try to get the dog to come up the hill.

-MCSO arrested Clifford Eugene Bradley, 47, on a warrant for Failure to Appear/Possession of Methamphetamine, Driving While Suspended - misdemeanor and Possession of Marijuana within 1,000 Feet of a School Zone. He was lodged at Umatilla County Jail with \$30,000 bail. He was also arrested on a warrant for Failure to Appear/Driving While Suspended - misdemeanor with \$935 bail in full.

-MCSO received a request from a Umatilla County Sheriff's Deputy to contact an individual to ask him if he knows where his car is. A MCSO Deputy attempted contact.

-MCSO received request for emergency response from a male in Irrigon who reported a 45-year-old woman, possibly pregnant and possibly having a miscarriage, with extreme pain and heavy vaginal bleeding. Irrigon Ambulance responded and the female was transported.

-MCSO, Heppner Ambulance received report of a 71-year-old female who had fallen in Heppner and was unable to get up. She was transported.

-MCSO received report of a green and tan cooler stolen out of the caller's pickup the previous night in Lexington.

-MCSO received report from a woman in Irrigon that a TV was stolen between the previous night and three days ago when she had to kick individuals out. She said they had taken pillows and linens.

-MCSO cited Patricia Dawn Cox, 23, for Violation of the Basic Rule, 82 mph in a 55 mph zone.

-MCSO received report of suspicious circumstances and a broken window in Irrigon. The caller wanted to know if they could clean up the glass before they made a report. A deputy responded and determined that the pane fell out due to age of the building.

-MCSO received a request from a subject in Irrigon to remove an unwanted subject from her property. She said the male subject was there trying to

get his children. Deputies responded and the male left with his children.

-MCSO received a transferred 911 call with a report from a male subject who said he found his kids in Irrigon, he has custody of them and wants them back. The sheriff advised to call in when he found them and requested contact.

-MCSO received report of a blue Blazer with loud pipes speeding through the area in Irrigon.

-MCSO received report from a woman in Boardman that an assault had just occurred and a 40-50-year-old male resident had come in covered in blood with a split lip. He was transported by Boardman Ambulance to Good Shepherd Hospital in Hermiston.

-Heppner Ambulance reported they were making an EMS transport to Lexington.

**November 8:** Morrow County Sheriff's Office received report of suspicious circumstances in Irrigon with the caller hearing someone at the back door and the dog barking. The caller said it sounded like someone trying to open the door and she could see a shadow that went by the window. MCSO responded, but was unable to locate anything.

-MCSO, Irrigon Ambulance received report of a vehicle that hit a power pole in Irrigon. Irrigon Fire, Irrigon Ambulance and MCSO responded. There was no transport. MCSO cited Laurence Walter Steagall for Careless Driving involving a motor vehicle accident.

-MCSO arrested Levi J. Fleming, 23, on an Irrigon Justice Court warrant for Failure to Appear/Criminal Trespass II. He was lodged at the Umatilla County Jail with \$340.30 bail in full.

-MCSO received report from a subject at Paterson Ferry Road that her mother's car was parked by a fence; there was a warrant out for her mother and she believed that her mother was in a vehicle driven by her cousin. She said she knew the cousins were hiding the mother and that they were going to get the car because it has her mother's stuff in it. She said she did not know where her mother was at the time.

-MCSO received report from a man in Irrigon that someone tried to run him off the road, but he did not want to sign a citation. He said the offense actually happened in Umatilla.

-MCSO arrested a male on Umatilla County Sheriff's Office warrants. The subject was lodged at Umatilla County Jail with no bail.

-MCSO received report of white SUVs racing and running the caller off the road on Hwy. 730.

-MCSO received report from a male subject on Gilmore Street in Heppner that cows were in his back yard. He said the fence was down and needed to be fixed. A subject responded to take care of the issue.

-MCSO received report from an Irrigon woman that she kept getting text messages from a phone number with pictures of men's genitalia. She said she asked them to stop, but they refused. MCSO responded and attempted the phone number, but were advised that it is no longer in service. She said she would contact her cell provider and have that number blocked.

-MCSO received report from a subject on I-84, Boardman that a car hit a deer or elk and it was still in the road, with cars

swerving around it. MCSO, Boardman Ambulance and Boardman Fire Department responded.

-Boardman Ambulance reported a possible DUI driver on I-84 east-bound that crossed the line several times.

-MCSO received report from a towing business that a car was in the ditch on the east-bound side of the road on I-84, Boardman. MCSO believed that OSP had tagged the vehicle.

-MCSO received report of a semi that kept hitting the rumble strip, then going partially in the other land on I-84 Boardman. The call was transferred to OSP.

-Heppner Fire Department reported that they were securing the landing zone in Heppner for life flight.

-MCSO deputy advised he was out checking on a vehicle on Eighth Rd./ Depot Lane in Irrigon. It was determined that the subject was doing some cellular testing.

-MCSO received report from a subject in Irrigon that someone named Amanda had just taken her backpack and shoes. The caller advised she would be on Washington Lane in Irrigon wearing a bright orange coat, waiting for contact. MCSO arrested Amanda Sue Walton, 31, for Theft III. She was lodged at Umatilla County Jail with \$1,500 bail.

-MCSO received request for extra patrol in Boardman from a woman who said her husband was gone hunting and her dog was making a lot of noise.

-MCSO received report of a male having trouble breathing in Irrigon. He

was transported to Good Shepherd Hospital in Hermiston.
