

Sheriff's Report

November 23: -Morrow County Sheriff's Office received report of a semi truck and trailer west-bound on Hwy. 730 at a high rate of speed. MCSO responded and warned Gurbir Singh, 38, for speed.

-MCSO received report of a lost hunter from a caller on Forest Service Rd. 21. The caller said it should have taken only about two hours to walk out, but they had not seen him. The hunter was located.

-MCSO received report of a dark green 1993 Mercury Villager stolen in Irrigon. The vehicle was entered as stolen.

-MCSO received a hang-up 911 call from a cell phone. On call back, the caller reported a vehicle accident on Hwy. 74, milepost 34.

-MCSO received a report of a vehicle that had rolled and was in the ditch on Hwy. 74, milepost 34, Lexington. MCSO, Ione Fire Department, Heppner Ambulance and Heppner Fire Department responded. The subject inside the vehicle was conscious, but not able to get out of the vehicle. The ambulance was cleared with the patient's refusal to transport. MCSO arrested Jeffrey Wayne Hams, 50, for DUII with a BAC of .21. He was released on his own recognizance with a pending court date.

-MCSO received a 911 call, but there was no answer, only background noise that sounded like a friendly get-together with no conflict.

-MCSO received report of a domestic disturbance in Lexington. The caller said she was being pushed around and a male was trying to handle her. There were no attempts to hit her.

-MCSO received report from an Ione woman that her ex-boyfriend was intoxicated and trying to take their two-year-old daughter. Deputies responded and arrested Curtis Scott Thompson, 27, for Interfering with a 911 call and Criminal Mischief II. He was lodged at Umatilla County Jail with \$12,000 bail.

-MCSO received report from a Heppner woman that a woman had come to her residence intoxicated. The caller advised that the woman does stay at the residence and was currently in the back bedroom not causing a disturbance. MCSO arrested Sherry Lynn Nelson, 50, on a parole detainer. She was lodged at Umatilla County Jail.

-MCSO received report from a male on I-84 Boardman that his vehicle had just been rear-ended west of the 165 exit. The caller advised that three people were in the vehicle and all had headaches. He also reported that the other vehicle went off the road. MCSO, Boardman Police Department, Boardman Ambulance and Boardman Fire Department responded. MCSO searched for the other vehicle but was unable to locate it. The ambulance was cleared with patient refusal for transport. A 23-year-old subject was cited for No Operator's License.

-MCSO received report of a small red Dodge pickup driving at a high rate of speed and driving off the roadway on Hwy. 730, Irrigon. MCSO responded, contacted the owner of the vehicle and found no sign of intoxication.
