**December 31:** Morrow County Sheriff's Office Deputy reported being out with a vehicle that appeared to have rolled.

-MCSO received report from an Irrigon woman that her son saw a male subject in a black Blazer throwing mail out of the window.

-MCSO received report of a motion alarm in the bedroom of an Irrigon residence.

-MCSO, Heppner Ambulance received report of a male in Heppner with a possible heart attack. The caller said that nitro tablets had no effect.

-MCSO received report of a cat in a trap in Heppner. The cat was transported to Pet Rescue.

-MCSO received report of theft of electrical wire and supplies on Bombing Range Rd. and Homestead Rd. in Boardman.

-MCSO received report from Oregon State Police of a light blue Ford Excursion with its flashers on and failing to maintain lane and speed. MCSO arrested Adolfo Martin Mendez Lopez, 32, on probable cause charges of Reckless Driving and Attempting to Elude. He was lodged at Umatilla County Jail with \$13,500 bail.
