## Eastern Oregon artists invited to submit work to juried show

LA GRANDE — ArtsEast and the Art Center at the Old Library in La Grande invite Eastern Oregon artists to submit entries for the ArtsEast Biennial 2014 in August.

The Biennial show is a juried art competition open to all artists, 18 and over, residing in the following counties in Eastern Oregon: Baker, Gilliam, Grant, Harney, Malheur, Morrow, Umatilla, Union, Wallowa

and Wheeler.

Artists may submit up to three digital images with a \$35 entry fee by April 25. The work must have been created in the last two years.

Artwork previously exhibited in an Artists of Eastern Oregon Biennial show is not eligible. Artists will be notified of their acceptance by June 2-7. Accepted pieces must arrive at the Art Center July 21 and 22.

Cash prizes will be awarded to four honored artists, selected by guest juror Doug Russell, Art Faculty at Oregon State University in Corvallis.

Frank Janzen, Master Printmaker at Crow's Shadow Institute of the Arts in Pendleton, will be the featured keynote speaker on the evening of the opening reception (Aug. 1). He will also be holding a printmaking workshop for artists and non-artists on Aug. 2.

Artist are invited to join Robert Tomlinson and peers in a workshop to discuss "Presenting Your Portfolio." Local artists Denise Elizabeth Stone and Jan Clark will also be presenting a Batik Watercolor workshop. Dates and times for both workshops will be announced later.
