tests, 88 x-ray procedures, six CT scans, 14 EKG tests, five colonoscopy procedures, one endoscopy procedure, two colonoscopy/endoscopy procedures, six respiratory therapy procedures; Pioneer Memorial Clinic had 356 patient visits with 11 new patients, 40 seen by a nurse and six no-shows; Irrigon Medical Clinic had 182 patient visits with 21

new patients, 51 seen by a nurse and 13 no-shows; Heppner Ambulance had 17 total page-outs with 14 transports for \$15,925 in revenue, Boardman Ambulance had 29 page-outs with 23 transports for \$32,667 in revenue; Irrigon Ambulance had 25 page-outs with 20 transports for \$25,833 in revenue; there was one flight.

DA's Report

Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson has released the following report:

-Cory Robert Peterson, 23, was convicted of one count of Unlawful Delivery of Marijuana, a Class C felony, based on a plea of guilty. The defendant was sentenced to 24 months formal probation, case to be treated as conditional discharge upon completion of conditions. Conditions of

probation included 7.5 units to be used for 120 hours of community service, drug package, and no contact with named individuals, with certain evidence items

to be returned to the owner and other items forfeited to the state. Other counts were dismissed without conviction. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$1,500.
